FOSP and Spooktacular The annual Spooktacular was once again a very successful event with a record breaking £1,077.12 made on the night for FOSP funds. This money will be used to fund the swimming pool in January as well as helping towards some of the costs of Enrichment Week (which usually costs approx. £4k each year). Thank you to all who contributed to the success of this event either before, during or after. It goes without saying that these events cannot run without an incredible amount of goodwill from the parents, carers and staff who all give up their time to make them possible. I know there is always disappointment that, due to space, not every family can attend the event in its current format. Even though this year we had more tickets available than ever, demand outstripped tickets available. Ahead of next year FOSP are considering if there are ways of holding it in a slightly different format to open it up further BUT there is a huge caveat for this — they simply have to have more parents and carers actively volunteering to help out alongside the staff. On Friday we had parents and families who actually left the school in the last few years coming back to help, as without them it would not have been possible for the Spooktacular to even go ahead this year due to lack of helpers. On the newsletter last month, I did ask for more people to help but it fell to the same very small group of parents to run things with the staff. FOSP is fundamentally a parent and carer run group so with more people stepping forward and being willing to help then tasks and responsibilities can be shared much more evenly and it will create even better opportunities for all.

The next event FOSP are running is a Christmas Movie Night — when the date is decided we will let you know and openly welcome any new parents and carers to help out with the children on the night in order for it to go ahead.
