Adaptive Teaching

Adaptive teaching is the means by which the needs of <u>all</u> children are met in their usual class environment. This is also known as Quality First teaching. This involves teachers continually assess the children's needs and adjusting their teaching in real time to help all the children reach the same learning goals. Hillingdon's Ordinarily Available Provision document informs our Adaptive Teaching.

A Graduated Approach

All schools in the UK use a graduated approach to SEN support; this is for children who need support beyond adaptive teaching. The Assess, Plan, Do, Review cycle is used when supporting SEN children at school. Hillingdon's Ordinarily Available Provision document informs our Assess, Plan, Do, Review cycle and ensures a consistency of approach across local schools.

LEARN PANTOSAURUS' FIVE EASY RULES FOR STAYING SAFE



PRIVATES ARE PRIVATE

Your underwear covers up your private parts and no one should ask to see or touch them. Sometimes a doctor, nurse or family members might have to. But they should always explain why, and ask you if it's OK first. Remember, what's in your pants belongs only to you.

NO MEANS NO

You always have the right to say 'no' – even to a family member or someone you love. You're in control of your body and the most important thing is how YOU feel. If you want to say 'No', it's your choice.

S PEAK UP, SOMEONE CAN HELP

It's always good to talk about stuff that makes you upset. If you're worried, go and tell a grown up you trust – like a family member, teacher or one of your friend's parents. They'll say well done for speaking out and help make everything OK. You can also call Childline on **0800 1111** and someone will always be there to listen.

A LWAYS REMEMBER YOUR BODY BELONGS TO YOU

No one should ever make you do things that make you feel embarrassed or uncomfortable. If someone asks to see or tries to touch you underneath your underwear say 'NO' – and tell someone you trust and like to speak to.



ALK ABOUT SECRETS THAT UPSET YOU

There are good secrets and bad secrets. If a secret makes you feel sad or worried, it's bad – and you should tell an adult you trust about it straight away.




Remember all of these rules and they'll help you stay safe, just like Pantosaurus






