The forecast is indicating extreme high temperatures next week. With this in mind, the following measures will be in place at school:

**Next week, all children should wear either usual school uniform without a tie or PE uniform with shorts. Whichever they will be coolest and most comfortable in. Appropriate footwear with a closed toe must be worn.** Non-uniform plimsolls or lightweight sand shoes are acceptable. Socks are optional.

All children **must** bring a refillable water bottle – this is an essential item. Parents will be contacted if their child does not bring one and will need to drop one to the school office. All staff will be vigilant to the signs of heat exhaustion and will ensure that the children have plenty of regular drinks.

All children should bring a sun hat and wear suncream as usual. Additional shaded areas will be set up around the school site. The children will sit in the shade outside at break times but will not be permitted to run about or play in the sun. If the temperature is extremely high we will keep the children indoors.

Classroom windows will be opened early in the day to remove the heat and then closed sufficiently to allow air to ventilate but not allow in the heat. All classrooms will have oscillating fans to help circulate the air.
