#### **School Money**

Please remember to book your child on for dinner, break and milk each week as this saves staff a lot of time in the mornings. Bookings should be made for the week ahead; we will unbook your child if they are absent. You can make a last minute booking up to midnight the night before.

#### **School Fund**

The school budgetary position is worse than ever, and we not only greatly appreciate but also rely on the support of parents via our annual school fund collection. We ask for £30 school fund per family which can be paid now for the whole year or in three instalments of £10 per term. The school fund payment should be showing in your eldest child's payments on School Money. We appreciate there are many financial pressures at the moment and completely understand if you feel unable to pay this amount, we have set the system to enable you to choose to pay a lesser amount! Thanks to those families who have already contributed.

#### Allergy Aware

Due to children with severe allergies please do not to send nuts or coconut into school. e.g. Nutella. Please note Prime drinks contain coconut water and should not be brought to school.



#### Car Park

We kindly ask parents, grandparents, childminders etc. NOT to bring their cars into the turning circle either at drop off or pick up time. Please park and walk your child to/from the gate each day, we appreciate the road works are causing extra congestion and ask all parents to take extra care and be considerate towards others.

#### P6 Swimming

P6 are scheduled to go swimming this Friday.

#### PE Uniform

Pupils in P3-7 should come to school on PE days wearing their PE kit - a pair of <u>plain</u> navy shorts or jogging bottoms, their school polo and sweatshirt and a pair of trainers.

#### Covid-19

COVID-19 testing is no longer recommended or available for most people. If your child has a positive COVID-19 test result, they should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for three days after the day they took the test or from the day their symptoms started (whichever was earliest). After three days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is lower and they should return to school. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.

#### **Healthy Break**

Please remember to send a **healthy** snack for break (no chocolate, crisps or sweeties) or pay for school healthy break - 50p per day for toast and fruit and 10p per day for milk.

#### **Dinners**

The cost of school dinners will remain £2.60 per day, this cost is set by the Education Authority. Dinners should also be paid via School Money



Half Day of Strike Action by Teachers and School Leaders.

SCHOOL CLOSURE - Morning of Wednesday 29 November 2023

Dear Parent,

In light of the upcoming industrial action by teachers I met with the Board of Governors to consider the impact this is likely to have for Carrowdore Primary. As the action involves all five teaching unions in Northern Ireland and because teachers are not expected to give advance notice of participation, we are unable to ensure adequate staff to pupil ratios. We have therefore taken the decision to close Carrowdore Primary on the morning of Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> November.

#### Why?

Education in Northern Ireland has been systematically defunded in recent years, resulting in decimating reductions in support, resource and capacity for your children.

- The teaching profession has filled in the growing gaps, holding the fragmenting system together and protecting children from the impact of the cuts.
- Pay paralysis, when set alongside the working conditions of the teaching profession in Northern Ireland, is having a devastating impact on the profession, with clear evidence that we will not be able to recruit or retain teachers and school leaders in the future if these issues are not resolved. Education is in crisis.
- Other public sector workers in Northern Ireland have also received pay increases during this
- Teachers across the UK and Ireland have received their normal pay increases, several times over the last three years. Teachers in Northern Ireland have received nothing.
- All five teaching unions have been in dispute for over a year, during which time no offer has been made.
- During this year of dispute, action has been gradually escalated, in the hope that an offer of resolution would be forthcoming.
- Taking strike action is the last resort. This could have been avoided and, indeed, can still be avoided.
- The responsibility to resolve this dispute lies squarely with the employing authorities and the Department of Education.

The staff in Carrowdore Primary School are very conscientious and committed to the children, they always go above and beyond for our pupils and will not take part in this action lightly. A strike by teachers is highly unusual and teachers taking strike action will lose pay. As Governors we are dismayed that the Department of Education and the Education Authority have been unable to resolve this long running dispute and the ongoing impact reduced levels of funding are having on all our pupils.
