

Look Who's Talking





"We have a set of drivers that shape our Curriculum. Do you have something that drives you?"




Reception children have been enjoying the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' during their English lessons. Inspired by the book, the children explored different environments just like the family in the story, including grass, a river (which resulted in some very wet socks!), and squelchy mud. They used their senses to describe how each surface felt on their hands and feet, noticing the textures, temperatures and even the sounds they made. The children also talked about how their feet and hands looked after each adventure, developing their descriptive language and vocabulary. It was a fun, hands-on experience that brought the story to life and encouraged lots of enthusiastic discussion and imaginative learning.



Foxes Class have been exploring how the Britons responded to the Roman invasion. The children learned about the impact Roman rule had on Celtic life and focused on Boudicca, the Iceni queen who led a famous rebellion. Using historical sources, they made inferences about her personality and then created their own visual interpretations of Boudicca. The pupils have shown great curiosity and creativity as they brought this part of history to life.


