Wild Boar Class have been enjoying their science topic learning about the properties of different materials and their uses.

This term, children in **Foxes** Class have been exploring a unique and expressive drawing pathway using charcoal. Rather than focusing on traditional, observational drawing, they've been encouraged to use the medium in bold, dynamic ways to capture a sense of drama and performance. By working on a larger scale and using their whole bodies to draw, children are discovering that drawing can be a physical and immersive experience. Children will be developing their own narratives and characters, using expressive marks to bring their stories to life.







This week we investigated if different materials were thermal conductors or insulators to find out which would be best to use in a hot food container.
