Dance Champions: On Monday 26th January, Year 5 had the opportunity to attend a Dance Workshop at The Dean Academy. Pupils learned a short dance routine alongside children from several other local primary schools, helping them to develop teamwork, coordination and dance skills. They were a real credit to the school, demonstrating excellent behaviour and supporting one another throughout the day.

After learning the routine, all schools took part in a competition and performed their dances. We are delighted to announce that Parkend School were the winners! For some of the children, this was the first time they had received a medal, and they were absolutely beaming - you have made us incredibly proud!



Children in Hedgehog Class have enjoyed learning about 'how toys have changed' as part of their topic work. To bring this learning to life, they were delighted to welcome Mrs Roberts back into the classroom, who kindly shared a selection of toys from her own childhood, as well as some that had been passed down through her family.


The children were fascinated to see how toys have changed over time and had the opportunity to closely observe and discuss a variety of traditional toys, including a 70-year-old doll, a 50-year-old metal ride-on car, and a push-along drummer man. These hands-on experiences sparked lots of curiosity and thoughtful questions, helping the children to develop their understanding of the past and compare it with the toys they play with today.





Foxes Class updates:

In Year 3, pupils have been developing their understanding of fractions. They have been learning to recognise and represent fractions, find fractions of amounts, and explain their thinking using correct mathematical language. This work is helping to build strong foundations for more advanced number concepts in the future.



In Year 4, children have been focusing on column addition, learning how to add numbers efficiently and accurately using formal written methods. A strong emphasis has been placed on clear presentation, ensuring numbers are neatly aligned and calculations are easy to follow. This helps pupils to check their work carefully and develop confidence in their maths.

Year 4 pupils are also preparing for their Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). To support this, they are completing a daily multiplication challenge to build speed, accuracy and confidence with their times tables. Regular practice at home will greatly support this work as it is a National Test.

Wild Boar Class have been fantastic Curious Thinkers this week in Science. The children have thoroughly enjoyed asking thoughtful questions and confidently sharing their ideas, from "How far away are the planets from each other?" and "Why is gravity weaker on the Moon?" to bigger wonderings such as, "What is the universe expanding into if it is still expanding?"

They have carefully written their questions down and are eager to explore the answers together, showing great enthusiasm for learning as the topic continues. It has been wonderful to see their curiosity, creativity, and excitement for discovery grow throughout the week.
