• As you know Mr Chapman is now our Assistant Headteacher working across both schools in the Federation. Mr Chapman / our senior teacher Miss Goodchild is in charge in my absence on site at Husthwaite, please don't hesitate to contact them if they can be of any assistance.

Being the beginning of the academic year please can we remind all of our school uniform.

School uniform:	PE Kit:
Red or grey sweater/cardigan	Plain white or red t-shirt
White or red polo shirt	Navy/black shorts
Grey or black skirt, trousers or shorts	Tracksuit bottoms and sweatshirt (for outdoor PE)

Hair: Children with hair below the shoulder must have their hair tied back.

Jewellery:- For safety reasons, jewellery should not be worn in school. If a watch is worn, it is at your own risk. Plain stud type earrings may be worn with pierced ears but must be removed (independently) during PE sessions. This is in line with North Yorkshire County Council's policy.

No nail varnish or makeup.

We do have some second hand uniform in school for those families that might need this assistance. Please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Dixon in the school office.

- Playtime snack Please can we remind all we constantly promote healthy eating and being a healthy school.
 All EYFS and KS1 children are given a free piece of fruit / vegetable at playtime which we encourage all to take advantage of. Please can we ask that any playtime snacks brought in from home are of a healthy variety. Water bottles are for water only, no juice please.
- School Drop Off Please can we remind everyone that school starts at / registration is at 8.50am. The gate is officially opened at 8.40am and locked at 8.50am/after the school bus has arrived. Any child arriving after 8.50am is recorded as late (L) and if arrives after registration is closed at 9am is recorded as unauthorised (U).

What is it like to be a Committee member?

'Having been a School Governor since November 2023, I wanted to share some of my experiences and explain a bit more about what it is like to be a member of the Husthwaite and Sessay Local Governing Body.

Being a Governor is a great way to understand more about how the School's operate and support staff to improve the lives and education of the children and communities they serve. As a Governor, your role is to provide oversight of the School budget, curriculum, policies (including safeguarding), property and staff and act as a local voice to the trustees of the Elevate Multi-Academy Trust that we are now part of.

The Governing Body meets 3 times a year (once per term) for a couple of hours and Governor's should aim to visit at least one of the School's each term to maintain familiarity with the school and staff and discuss an area of school governance that you will have been assigned (known as a Link Governor). You do not need any specific skills or qualifications to be a Governor - however interest and experience in one of the areas listed above would be a great addition to our small group.
