A busy start to the academic year!

### **Pupil Voice Groups.**

All children have had their first meeting of the year; staff introduced the children to their new groups and welcomed new members by explaining the concept of Pupil Voice. They also outlined the types of planning each group will be involved in throughout the year. They then split into groups to plan out the year ahead.

<u>Money Makers</u> – The previous year's Money Makers put forward some great long-term ideas; this year Money Makers intend to continue to think of long-term goals and fundraising ideas. The children also planned our first event, Macmillan Cake Sale, and will soon be putting together ideas for Children in Need.

<u>Healthy Schools</u> - After a year focusing on physical health, we have shifted to thinking about mental health and ways we can keep ours healthy. After just one meeting, the children decided they were keen to resurrect the Calm Club at break, for those who wanted a quiet, relaxing activity.

<u>HEGG</u> (Husthwaite Eco Gardening Group): After celebrating last year's groups amazing achievement of RHS Level 3. We looked at what work we need to do to achieve Level 4. The Wildlife area will be a big feature of Level 4 as well as sharing our plants and seeds with others. Other jobs the children will be doing this half term will be tidying areas after the summer months and prepping areas for the autumn and winter.

Congratulations to last year's HEGG, over the holidays our RHS Level 3 award was approved.



<u>Epic Improvers</u>: To begin with we looked at the success of last year, primarily the erection of the outdoor reflection area, which will be up and running very soon. We then discussed the improvements in school that our Epic Improvers for this academic year want to see.



Phoebe L and Niamh, our Year 6 Collective Worship Spiritual Leaders, attended the second workshop of the Elevate MAT Church Schools Collective Worship group at South Kilvington Academy. They discussed the definition of worship – thinking about beliefs, praying, singing, talking together about school values and listening to stories with a moral. The definition of collective is so important to all of our School Community – being together, everyone in the school, and believing (mostly) the same thing. The children from Year 1 to 6 all watched an engaging video, introduced by Ant and Dec about the campaign and the importance of standing up for yourself and speaking out. No child should ever have to face any kind of harm or abuse, and through the valuable work of the NSPCC and all that we do in school, we hope to equip our children with the tools to speak out if something does not feel right. The children in Years 2/5/6 will be taking part in workshops led by NSPCC volunteers on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> October and we look forward to their visit.







Today is **European languages day**. 'Languages open hearts and minds'. We encourage children to appreciate the rich variety of languages and cultures from around Europe. Today as well as learning fun facts and undertaking different activities in class, the children are having an inspiring dance workshop, led by Natalie from Dance Days, inspired by different European countries, focusing on France and Spain.

**Hair**: Children with hair below the shoulder must have their hair tied back.

**Jewellery:**- For safety reasons, jewellery should not be worn in school. If a watch is worn, it is at your own risk. Plain stud type earrings may be worn with pierced ears but must be removed (independently) during PE sessions. This is in line with North Yorkshire County Council's policy.

# What is it like to be a Committee member?

'Having been a School Governor since November 2023, I wanted to share some of my experiences and explain a bit more about what it is like to be a member of the Husthwaite and Sessay Local Governing Body.

Being a Governor is a great way to understand more about how the School's operate and support staff to improve the lives and education of the children and communities they serve. As a Governor, your role is to provide oversight of the School budget, curriculum, policies (including safeguarding), property and staff and act as a local voice to the trustees of the Elevate Multi-Academy Trust that we are now part of.

The Governing Body meets 3 times a year (once per term) for a couple of hours and Governor's should aim to visit at least one of the School's each term to maintain familiarity with the school and staff and discuss an area of school governance that you will have been assigned (known as a Link Governor). You do not need any specific skills or qualifications to be a Governor - however interest and experience in one of the areas listed above would be a great addition to our small group.
