Well done to all our children who have taken exams this year: the phonics screening, multiplication check and KS2 SATS. I am waiting for a finalised report from the DfE but I am pleased to tell you that all our results were good from our youngest to our oldest children. In KS2 our children have achieved a higher score in reading, writing and grammar than the average age expected scores for the local authority and maths has risen to 71% just below the average for the local authority.


The children have also made 'Wanted' posters to find the big bad pirates who have escaped. It seems that Captain Jack Potter is the one that is most








































What's been happening in the Rowans classroom?




