Head Talk

Happy New Year! I do hope you all had a fabulous Christmas and New Year. The children started back well at school last week and were very quickly back to routine. We have had a busy first week back with Ofsted calling on our first day! This was our first recorded inspection since November 2014. Since this inspection we took part in a pilot inspection in 2018 and we had a virtual visit during COVID in 2020. So Ofsted have kept in touch with us. We got a call at 9.30am on the 6th January and the team were onsite at 7.50am on Tuesday 7th January. So the team got to see the school in its day-to-day routines.

I am unable to comment on the outcome of the inspection until the report is published. This will take some time as Ofsted have to write the report and then have it quality assured, before a draft is sent to me. I then have a chance to make any factual changes and ask for any language changes. This report is then sent back to be quality assured again before it is sent to me for publication to the community. Ofsted are not allowed to publish a report during a holiday period, so our report could come out after half term.

I would like to thank you all for taking part in the parent view questionnaire and for encouraging your children to do so too. The Ofsted team told me we had 187 pupil responses to the survey. This is brilliant. If you want to see the parent survey responses, please click on this link:

I am very proud of the children and the team and how they managed the inspection process. Now

Our current attendance is 95.6%. This is low. We have had a number of children who have been unwell and some families have taken holidays too. If your child has below 90% attendance, they will be classed as being persistently absent. This is not good. It means your child is missing too much education. Please ensure your child attends school. If we have concerns about your child's attendance, we will be writing to you and offering you a meeting to discuss any support that you may need. Our attendance should be 97% or above. Please help us to help your child. Our leading attending year group is Year 3 with 96.8% attendance. Keep up the excellent work.

School Uniform

As the new year has started, I have begun to see a number of children are coming to school in the incorrect uniform. I have listed the policy for your ease.

School v-neck jumper or navy, knitted style v-neck jumper or v- neck school cardigan or v-neck, knitted style navy cardigan
Light blue school logo polo top (to wear for events outside of the school grounds)
Light blue polo top
Grey trousers or grey shorts and black socks
Plain navy pinafore or skirt with plain navy tights

or navy socks
Black, low heel, school style shoes

P.E. Kit

1 x White school logo top Plain navy shorts

White socks

Trainers (plain sports style without adornments or LED lights)

Dark blue or black tracksuit bottoms (winter field use)

Dark jumper or sweatshirt (From September 2023 School jumper or cardigan) (winter field use)

General Rules

No nail varnish Shoulder length or longer hair to be tied back with a simple dark coloured scrunchie or elasticated band

Hair bands should be of a plain style in a dark colour with no adornments

Jewellery

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery to school, with an exception being made for:

- Simple watches that only tell time and do not distract the child or other children from their learning.
- Small earring studs in pierced ears.
- Small objects of religious significance.

It is essential that children do not wear any permitted item(s) of jewellery on a day that they have P.E. If this is unavoidable, then it is essential that they are able to remove any permitted item(s) of jewellery by themselves for P.E. lesson, to prevent any potential injuries from occurring.

Headscarves/Hijab

These may be worn for religious reasons but must be plain and in keeping with the school colours. These must also be removed during P.E. lessons, unless the Headteacher has given permission following consultation with the parent/carer.
