#### **Head Talk**

This week I wanted to highlight a 'must see' on Netflix, if you have access to it. The programme that I am talking about is 'Adolescence'. This is a 4-episode series, that focuses on the role that social media plays in young people's lives, with very tragic outcomes. I would recommend that any parent/carer, that is considering giving their child a device to access social media, watch this and think about how they can coach their child and understand the world that they are going to get into.

At Hamilton Primary School, we are seeing more and more incidents of children getting involved in online chats outside of school, that spill over into school time and adversely affect the children's mood and ability to manage their emotions. Children do not have access to their phones at school and this will continue.

I am planning on running a parent/carer session in the summer term for all parents/carers of children that have access to a device that can access messaging and social media, to explain the risks associated with them and I will also be focussing on the impact of AI technology on this area too. This will be a face to face event in the school hall, as online events are not as effective at getting the message across. Please look out for a booking form via MCAS in the next few days.

On a slightly different note, the Learning Conferences last week seemed to go very well. I spoke to a number of families and the feedback was very positive. These are still a great way to open the school up for you to see the work that your child has undertaken and provide you with an opportunity to discuss the progress they are making. The next update on progress will be the end of year report. This year we will be sending an 'e-version' of the report only. If you require a

We are not too far from the Easter Break. The PSA have a couple of events planned before the end of the term - so keep an eye out for these!

Our current attendance is 95.9%. This is low, but we are 0.2% better than 2 weeks ago. We have had a number of children who have been unwell, and some families have taken holidays too. If your child has below 90% attendance, they will be classed as being persistently absent. This is not good. It means your child is missing too much Please ensure your child attends education. school. If we have concerns about your child's attendance, we will be writing to you and offering you a meeting to discuss any support that you may need. Our attendance should be 97% or above. Please help us to help your child. Our leading attending year group is Year 3 with 96.8% attendance. Keep up the excellent work.

#### **Spotlight on SEND**

I read an article this week about the importance of teaching vocabulary. One study has found that oral literacy shows a downward trend since COVID. Having a good vocabulary not only supports our children with their attainment, it provides them with the confidence and ability to express themselves which in turn can lead to a positive sense of mental wellbeing and behaviour. Here are

a couple of games you can play with your children to develop their vocabulary and oral literacy skills:

- Top Trumps supporting vocabulary expansion
- Headbandz supporting questioning skills, categories and concepts
- Guess Who supporting questioning skills, expressive language and auditory memory

I'm sure you can think of more and have them hidden in cupboards. Have fun and keep talking!
