### Head Talk

Welcome to this week's newsletter. We have had a busy few weeks back and the children are learning well. This week we had a 'Peer to Peer' review with 2 headteachers from local schools coming in on Tuesday morning with a focus on the action point from our last Ofsted inspection: *To investigate whether the support provided to pupils with SEND is based on an accurate understanding of their needs and that staff who work with these pupils have a secure understanding of how to deliver this provision.*

We had a very positive morning walking the school with Mrs Arnold (SENCo) and looking at learning and talking with children who have additional needs. The report has not been written up yet by the visiting heads, but I will share the headlines with you all once I have the report. What I can say is that the children and staff were brilliant and we did not 'prepare' anything different for this supportive visit.

We have also had our Year 5 children swimming this week and I would like to thank all the staff, especially Mr Greatorex, who is getting into the pool to support a child, so that they can access the swimming lessons.

You may also have noticed that Constantine Road is going to be impacted by the gas works that are taking place. At the moment we think the road will be closed at the junction with Maldon Road from the 9th February. This means there will be limited access to the school. Please plan your journey in advance and know that there will be very limited parking in the roads. If you can walk to school, please do.

Our current attendance is 96.9%. I want this number to be 97% or higher. We have had a

number of children who have been unwell and some families have taken holidays too. If your child has below 90% attendance, they will be classed as being persistently absent. This is not good. It means your child is missing too much education. Please ensure your child attends school. If we have concerns about your child's attendance, we will be writing to you and offering you a meeting to discuss any support that you may need. Please help us to help your child. Our leading attending year group is Year 4 with 97.9% attendance. Keep up the excellent work.

## SEND Spotlight – Using Visuals

We have always used visuals in school to support language and communication but we are now using a programme called Widgit so that there is a more uniform approach across the school. The programme allows teachers to create visual timetables, symbol-supported worksheets, and communication grids, helping pupils to navigate the school day independently. If you come into school you may see these it has been used to create door signs, in social stories and on staff lanyards to support communication. EYFS have used the programme to create communication boards to support children's language development. They are on the wall in a central place and the children will take an adult to the board to help them try to explain a problem or ask for something. It has been really successful and the staff working in EYFS have seen children's use of language and confidence grow.
