Show your family how you double numbers to 5 on your fingers, then using objects can you remember how to double a number bigger than 5 by adding two numbers that are the same and counting on from the first number. You can use objects to help you.
- Collect a cosy blanket, some cushions and make a super comfy area. Snuggle up with your family and read your very favourite story together.
