



Key Instant Recall Facts

Year 2—Spring 2

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts **with speed and accuracy**:

I know multiplication and division facts for the 5 times table

$0 \times 5 = 0$	$5 \times 0 = 0$		
$1 \times 5 = 5$	$5 \times 1 = 5$	$5 \div 5 = 1$	$5 \div 1 = 5$
$2 \times 5 = 10$	$5 \times 2 = 10$	$10 \div 5 = 2$	$10 \div 2 = 5$
$3 \times 5 = 15$	$5 \times 3 = 15$	$15 \div 5 = 3$	$15 \div 3 = 5$
$4 \times 5 = 20$	$5 \times 4 = 20$	$20 \div 5 = 4$	$20 \div 4 = 5$
$5 \times 5 = 25$	$5 \times 5 = 25$	$25 \div 5 = 5$	$25 \div 5 = 5$
$6 \times 5 = 30$	$5 \times 6 = 30$	$30 \div 5 = 6$	$30 \div 6 = 5$
$7 \times 5 = 35$	$5 \times 7 = 35$	$35 \div 5 = 7$	$35 \div 7 = 5$
$8 \times 5 = 40$	$5 \times 8 = 40$	$40 \div 5 = 8$	$40 \div 8 = 5$
$9 \times 5 = 45$	$5 \times 9 = 45$	$45 \div 5 = 9$	$45 \div 9 = 5$
$10 \times 5 = 50$	$5 \times 10 = 50$	$50 \div 5 = 10$	$50 \div 10 = 5$
$11 \times 5 = 55$	$5 \times 11 = 55$	$55 \div 5 = 11$	$55 \div 11 = 5$
$12 \times 5 = 60$	$5 \times 12 = 60$	$60 \div 5 = 12$	$60 \div 12 = 5$

Key vocabulary

Multiply- Adding equal groups a certain number of times
e.g. $4 \times 5 = 5+5+5+5 = 20$. This can also be referred to as groups of or lots of.

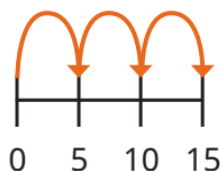
Divide- Sharing or grouping numbers/objects into equal groups
Eg $20 \div 5 = 4$.

What can this look like?

Concrete: $5 \times 5 =$



Pictorial: $3 \times 5 =$



Abstract:

$6 \times 5 = 30$
6 groups of 5 = 30
 $5+5+5+5+5+5 = 30$
5 multiplied by 6 = 30
30 divided by 5 = 6

Top tips

* The secret to success is practising **little and often**. Use time wisely. Can you practise this KIRF whilst walking to school or during a car journey? You do not need to practise all aspects of the KIRF all at once; perhaps you could have a fact of the day, or a few facts per week to practise?

* Use what you already know – If your child knows that $4 \times 5 = 20$, they can use this fact to work out that $8 \times 5 = 40$

* Note: Children should be able to answer five times table calculations in any order, including missing number questions e.g. $5 \times _ = 45$ or $_ \div 5 = 7$

Key questions -

What is 5 multiplied by 8?

What is 5 times 7?

What is 55 divided by 5?

Why not enjoy watching numberblocks—sing along as you practise your 5 times tables.



Things to try

Chanting- Say the times table facts out loud, 1 times 5 is 5, 2 times 5 is 10 etc.

Can you beat Siri?- Ask Siri a 5 times table question, see if you can answer it before Siri does!

Spot patterns—what patterns can you spot when write out the 5 times tables in order?

Test the parent – Your child can make up their own tricky division questions for you e.g. What is 50 divided by 5? They need to be able to multiply to create these questions.

Chalk sums- Use chalk on an outside patio/path to write out the 5 times table.
