What's been happening in school this week... Robins (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

This week in Science, Robins have been learning about recycling. We learnt about the process for recycling plastic and glass bottles. We also discussed the importance of recycling and the impact it has on the environment.

We have continued our dance topic in PE. This week, we were pretending to be stretchy men, the children worked in small groups to create some fantastic dance routines

We also had our open classroom this week. The children and their grown-ups worked very hard to create some fantastic fire engines!





Jays (Year 3 and Year 4)



This week in Literacy, we have been reading about all the disgusting things that George put in his marvellous medicine. We have been learning about the features of instructions. Next week, we will be writing our own instructions!

In Maths, Year 4 have completed their addition and subtraction unit and are all enjoying some work on area. Year 3 are continuing to embed their knowledge of the different strategies for effective addition and subtraction.

We have also been learning about the journey of a river from the source to its mouth and the importance of rivers in our topic lesson. We have also been sorting animals in many different ways

(vertebrate /invertebrate, habitats, if they lay eggs or don't, habitats, 5 main groups etc). In unihoc, we are continuing to develop our basic skills and have had a couple of practice games to start to put these skills into practice.

Victoria and Mabel also made a fabulous Egyptian outfit which we wanted to share with you this week!

Owls (Year 5 and Year 6)

We have continued to work on our new Geography topic in Owls this week. This week we found out about how the water cycle and photosynthesis impact the development of life within a biome. We reviewed what these processes are and discussed how they influence each other.

We have been continuing with our work on fractions in maths this week – we have been working hard to find common denominators and to convert fractions to their simplest form. We have also been adding and subtracting fractions.

In English this week we have continued to read and discuss various aspects of our class novel Ways to Make Sunshine. We have also been learning about how to use apostrophes in a range of different ways – these have included apostrophes for contraction, singular possession and plural possession.

Year 6 also really enjoyed taking part in their first bikeability session on Wednesday this week. All of the children made an enormous amount of progress from their individual starting levels and we are really proud of what they all achieved. Some children will be continuing with their next bikability award next week.
