What's been happening in school this week...

Robins (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

This week in Robins we have been pretending we are Samuel Pepys and writing our own diary entry about The Great Fire of London. We have also been working on our Geometry topic in Maths. The children are gaining a really good understanding of the different 2-D and 3-D shapes and their properties.

This week in Art we have finished our Mono-printing that we started last week. We looked at work by Xgaoc'o X'are, inspired by his work we created our own work experimenting with shape, colour and textures.

We have also had lots of fun playing outside with the snow/ ice and making the classroom look festive.



Jays (Year 3 and Year 4)

On Wednesday we really enjoyed working with our parents and classmates counting like an Egyptian! Thank you for joining us!

Earlier this week we learned in detail about Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and the many artefacts that were found.

In science, we are learning about living things and this week we looked at the different types of invertebrates. We had a hunt in the school field and were surprised (and delighted) to find snails, worms and centipedes despite the freezing weather! Our tackling skills in Unihoc are improving too!

The Year 4s are continuing to improve their multiplication and division facts and more TTRS certificates have been awarded! Year 3 have been working on their Number bonds to 100 as they come to the end of their adding and subtraction work.



Owls (Year 5 and Year 6)

We really enjoyed welcoming members of our families into our classroom on Wednesday this week. We shared some of our learning about biomes with them and talked to them about the specific biomes that we had researched individually. We then went on to work with our family members to make miniature versions of the different biomes that we had found out about. We produced some amazing work and were really proud of what we achieved!

We have also been using our biome research in our English lessons this week to plan our own information texts about our chosen biome. We have learnt about what this type of text would typically include and have begun to plan our own information leaflets.

Also English, we have continued to focus on the text One Plastic Bag by Miranda Paul. This short story talks about how plastic recycling can make a huge difference to the world that we live in. We are using this text to help to theme our ideas for the Farmers' Market next Friday. We will be making various items from recycled plastic bags to sell on our stall.

We have continued with our work on fractions in Maths and have all done really well with what is a really tricky topic. We now know a lot more about common denominators and how to find them and can all add and subtract improper fractions and mixed numbers. Year 6 have also been learning how to multiply fractions by integers and other fractions and also how to divide a fraction by an integer.









Cross Country Champions

Congratulations to our fabulous Key Stage 2 runners! Two weeks ago, several of our pupils met at Stubbs Fiend for the HX7 Cluster event. All pupils ran really well—that slope is steeper than you think! The conditions were very cold and muddy which all added to the challenge. All the runners gave their best and all crossed the finish line. We knew on the day that Mabel and Theadora would qualify for the Calderdale Finals after finishing an impressive second and third place respectively. Once the official results had come out, we were thrilled to see that Elizabeth and Joseph had also qualified, once the schools teams of 5 were taken out.
