## A Sense of Belonging

This half term we focus a great deal on forming bonds with and between the children, ensuring they and you feel welcomed and gain a sense of belonging to our school. All of the children have a key group with a keyworker.

We ask you to support us this term by completing the 'All About Me' sheet for your child, share on your heart with 'hopes and wishes' for their coming year and providing a family photo (one that contains your child with other family members, this can be immediate or wider family the choice is yours). Photographs will be displayed within your child's group room. If you are unable to print you can share them on Tapestry and we will print for you. We share these with the children and scribe their words, you could help by noting who's who on the photo reverse or on Tapestry.







## **Makaton Signs**

At school we use Makaton signs alongside many spoken words. Signs and gestures support and strengthen the children's communication skills. We will share the signs with you as we introduce them. Each week we will be sharing signs with you too, our first signs are 'hello' and 'goodbye', followed by 'stop' next week.

We find teaching children the 'stop' sign early not only empowers them when faced with challenge and also encourages children to pause and take account of others; maybe to listen, watch, take turns, etc.

Staff consistently model signs to support children.

Our sign of the week will be displayed on the front door and our basic signs can be found around the school and on our website

## Wellcomm Speech and Language Assessment

As part of our curriculum offer we assess all of our N2 children using the Wellcomm toolkit. N2 children are the children entering primary school next year.

Wellcomm is a speech and language toolkit that is designed to assess children's speech and language skills. Not how they talk but the language they use and the language and grammar they understand.

Cess Bone, our speech and language support, completes all of the Wellcomm assessments and follows up when required working with the children in small groups or individually. Results of the assessments will be shared with you and your child's keyworker to ensure the best start for your child.
