1. Aims

This policy aims to:

- Explain how to apply for a place at a school in White Woods Primary Academy Trust
- Set out the arrangements for allocating places to the pupils who apply
- Explain how to appeal against a decision not to offer your child a place

2. Legislation and statutory requirements

This policy is based on the following statutory guidance from the Department for Education (DfE):

- [School Admissions Code 2021](#)
- [School Admission Appeals Code](#)

We are required by our funding agreement to comply with these codes, and with the law relating to admissions as set out in the [School Standards and Framework Act 1998](#).

This policy complies with our funding agreement and articles of association.

2.1 The schools admission code states that admission authorities must provide for the admission of all children in the September following their fourth birthday.

3. Definitions

- 3.1. **Normal admissions** round is the period during which parents can apply for state-funded school places at a school's normal point of entry, using the common application form provided by their home local authority.
- 3.2. **Looked-after children** are children who, at the time of making an application to a school, are:
 - In the care of a local authority, or
 - Being provided with accommodation by a local authority in exercise of its social services functions
- 3.3. **Previously looked-after children** are children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they:
 - Were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 or the Adoption and Children Act 2002, or
 - Became subject to a child arrangements order, or
 - Became subject to a special guardianship order

This includes children who appear to have been in state care outside of England and have ceased to be in state care due to being adopted.

3.4. **Compulsory school age**

A child reaches compulsory school age on the prescribed day following their 5th birthday (or on their 5th birthday if it falls on a prescribed day). The prescribed days are 31 December, 31 March and 31 August

3.5. **Deferred Entry**

This refers to a child starting school later in the same academic year for which they were offered a place. Parents can defer the date their child is admitted to the school until later in the school year but not beyond the point at which they reach compulsory school age (see above) and not beyond the beginning of the final term of the school year for which it was made.

For example, a child offered a place for September 2027 who turns 5 in October would need to start by 1st January, 2028. The child still starts in the correct chronological year group (Reception), but at the beginning of the spring term (January) or summer term (April) instead of the autumn term (September). The school place is held for the child.

3.6. **Delayed Entry**

This is a more formal and evidence-based process.

This is for "summer-born" children—those born between April 1st and August 31st. It allows a parent to request that their child starts school a full year later, in the September following their fifth birthday. The child would then be admitted to a Reception class with a younger cohort of children, rather than moving directly into Year 1 with their chronological peers. This is a request, not a statutory right.

3.7 **Places outside of a child's normal age**

Families may seek a place for their child outside of his/her normal age group under various circumstances such as ill health, if the child is gifted and talented or when the child has experienced problems.

3.8 **Siblings**

For a child to be considered a sibling, one of the following conditions must exist:-

- brother/sister to be permanently resident at the same address.
- stepbrother/stepsister to be permanently resident at the same address.
- half-brother/half-sister to be permanently resident at the same address.

- brother/sister who do not live at the same residence but, who share the same parents.
- child of the parent/carer's partner to be permanently resident at the same address.
- adopted brother/sister permanently resident at the same address
- foster brother/sister resident at the same address You may be asked to provide proof e.g., Birth Certificate and Proof of residence

4. How to apply

4.1. Normal Admission process

You should use the application form provided by your home local authority (regardless of which local authority the schools are in). You can use this form to express your preference for a minimum of 3 state-funded schools, in rank order.

Please see the timeline section 5 for deadlines.

Please note, pupils already attending one of our nurseries will not transfer automatically into reception in the attached school (or any of our other schools). A separate application must be made for a place in reception.

Please note, pupils attending one of our infant schools will not transfer automatically into one of our junior schools. A separate application must be made for a place.

4.2. Admission of children below compulsory age and deferred entry to school

A child is entitled to a full time place in the September following their fourth birthday. Parents must apply for a school place in the normal admissions round by the deadline usually mid-January for entry in September of that year. (as above)

Once a place is offered, parents must accept it and then formally notify the school and the Local Authority in writing that they wish to defer their child's start date.

The offered school place will be held for the child, and it will not be re-offered to another child.

Entry cannot be deferred beyond the point at which the child reaches compulsory school age (see 3.5 above).

Where the parents wish children may attend part time until later in the school year but not beyond the point at which they reach compulsory school age.

Upon receipt of the offer of a place parents should notify the school as soon as possible that they wish to either defer their child's entry to school or take up a part time place.

4.3. **Delayed Entry** (Summer-Born Children)

Parents should first discuss their request with the headteachers of their preferred schools.

You must submit the standard school place application for your child's normal age group by the January deadline. (As per how to apply above)

Concurrently, you must complete a specific "Summer Born Delayed Admission Request" form and submit it to the Council.

The request must be supported by evidence, such as medical reports, letters from educational professionals, or other information detailing the child's academic, social, and emotional development.

The decision is made by the admission authority on a case-by-case basis. They will consider the views of the parents, headteachers, and relevant professionals, as well as the overall best interests of the child.

4.4 **Places outside of a child's normal age**

Families may seek a place for their child outside of his/her normal age group under various circumstances such as ill health, if the child is gifted and talented or when the child has experienced problems. Parents wishing to request that their child is admitted outside of the normal age group must still make an application in the usual way to RMBC by the specified closing date and also, alongside, submit to RMBC a formal request for admission outside of the normal age group. This request will be considered by the Trust (as the Admission Authority) taking account of the views of:- the head teacher; the parent's views; information about the child's academic, social, and emotional development; where relevant, their medical history and the views of a medical professional; whether they have previously been educated out of their normal age group; and whether they may naturally have

fallen into a lower age group if it were not for being born prematurely. The Trust requests parents to engage in early conversation with the school regarding any such intention.

If Approved: The original application for the normal age group is withdrawn. You must then make a new application the following year for a place in Reception. It is important to note that approval does not guarantee a place at your preferred school in the following year; the new application will be considered alongside all other applicants.

If Refused: You must decide whether to accept the place offered in the normal age group (Reception) or to decline it and make an in-year application for a Year 1 place the following year, bypassing the Reception year entirely. There is no right of appeal against a refusal to admit a child to a different age group, but you can appeal if a school refuses to offer a place in the relevant year group.

Future Transitions

If delayed entry is agreed, a new request must be made when the child transition to junior or secondary school to ensure they continue to be educated out of their chronological year group.

4.5 **Children of UK service personnel (UK Armed Forces)** – For families of service personnel with a confirmed posting to the area, or crown servants returning from overseas to live in the area, admission authorities must allocate a place in advance of the family arriving in the area provided the application is accompanied by an official letter that declares a relocation date and a Unit postal address or quartering area address when considering the application against their oversubscription criteria. This must include accepting a Unit postal address or quartering area address for a service child. Admission authorities must not refuse a service child a place because the family does not currently live in the area, or reserve blocks of places for these children

5. Normal Admissions Timeline

Children do not automatically transfer from one phase of education to another and for all children requiring a place in reception, requiring a transfer from an infant only school to a junior school, and those transferring from primary to secondary an application must be made. This includes children already in a school based nursery who require a place in the

reception class.

6. Allocation of places

6.1. Children with Special Educational Needs.

A small number of children will have an Education Health Care Plan that names this school and these children will be admitted to the school if named as part of that process. The majority of children with special educational needs will not require an Education Health Care Plan. Applications for children who have special educational needs but no Education Health Care Plan, will be considered on the basis of the Admission Authority's published admissions criteria.

6.2. Priority Order

For all other applications places will be allocated in the following order of priority:

1. Relevant Looked After Children and previously looked after children refer to 3.2.
2. Children who, on 15th January 2027, have an exceptional, confirmed medical need which the Admission Authority is satisfied makes attendance at this school

essential, due to its unique ability to meet that need. This does not include common conditions that can be managed by many mainstream schools.

The Trust requires a letter on headed paper from an independent medical consultant or specialist, detailing the child's diagnosis and explaining why the child's specific and exceptional needs can only be met at this school and no other. The letter must explicitly state the unique facilities, expertise, or resources at the school that are essential for the child's health and well-being.

All applications under this criterion will be reviewed by a panel comprising senior leaders and/or designated admission officers. The panel will, where necessary, seek independent advice to evaluate the evidence provided and ensure consistency. The final decision will be based on the panel's assessment of whether the supporting evidence clearly demonstrates that this school is uniquely essential for the child's medical needs. All decisions and the reasoning will be recorded.

3. Children who on 15th January 2027, have a compelling and verifiable social need which the Admission Authority is satisfied can only be met at this school, and which, if not met, would cause significant and lasting detriment to the child's well-being or seriously impair their educational progress. This does not include a parent's wish for a child to attend due to friendship groups, after-school activities, or personal domestic/childcare arrangements.

The Trust requires independent, written evidence from a relevant professional (such as a social worker, educational psychologist, a senior member of staff from the child's current school, or a professional from a recognised support service) who has direct knowledge of the child. The evidence must clearly and explicitly state why attendance at this specific school is essential, and why the child's needs cannot be met at any other school.

All applications made under this criterion will be assessed by a panel of senior school staff and/or admissions officers. The panel will consider the evidence provided and the specific circumstances of the case to determine if the criteria are met. The panel's decision will be final, and parents will be notified in writing of the outcome and the reasons for the decision.

Please note: Very few cases are agreed annually on exceptional medical or social grounds.



4. Children who, on 15th January 2027, live in the catchment area of this school as defined by the Admissions Authority and it is expected will have an older brother or sister on the roll of this school in Years 1-6 at the start of the academic year 2027
5. Children who, on 15th January 2027, live in the catchment area of the school as defined by the Admissions Authority (see appendices)
6. Children who, on 15th January 2027, it is expected will have an older brother or sister on the roll of the preferred school in Years 1-6 at the start of the academic year 2027.
7. Children who, on 15th January 2027, live nearest to the school measured by a straight line on a horizontal plane, (commonly known as measurement "as the crow flies").

Over-subscription - In the event of oversubscription with any criterion preference will be given to children who live nearest to the school as the crow flies.

7. Admission numbers

8. Tie break

In the case of 2 or more applications that cannot be separated by the oversubscription criteria outlined above, we will use the distance between the school and a child's home as a tie breaker to decide between applicants. Priority will be given to children who live closest to the school.

Distance will be measured in a straight line from the child's home address to the school's front gates. A child's home address will be considered to be where they are resident for the majority of nights in a normal school week.

Where the distance between 2 or more children's homes and the school is the same, random allocation* will be used to decide between them. This process will be independently verified.

* The random allocation process will involve drawing random sealed envelopes with the name of one child per envelope.

9. Challenging behaviour

We will not refuse to admit a child on behavioural grounds in the normal admissions round or at any point in the normal year of entry. We may refuse admission in certain cases where

the specific criteria listed in the School Admissions Code (paragraph 3.8) apply, i.e. where section 87 of the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 is engaged.

We may refuse admission for an in-year applicant for a year group that isn't the normal point of entry, only in such a case that we have good reason to believe that the child may display challenging behaviour that may adversely affect the provision we can offer. In this case, we will refer these pupils to the Fair Access Protocol. We will not refuse admission on these grounds to looked-after children, previously looked-after children and children with EHC plans listing 1 of our schools.

10. Fair Access Protocol

The Trust participates fully in the Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council (RMBC) Fair Access Protocol. This protocol is a statutory duty on all local authorities and schools to ensure that children who are without a school place, particularly the most vulnerable, are allocated a school place as quickly as possible.

The Fair Access Protocol is used to place children who are having difficulty securing a school place through the normal in-year admissions process. This may include:

- Children who have been out of education for a significant period.
- Children with special educational needs (but without an Education, Health and Care Plan), disabilities, or medical conditions.
- Children who are or have been in the care of social services, or are otherwise deemed vulnerable.
- Children with a history of challenging behavior who have been permanently excluded from a previous school.

When a child is referred to the Fair Access Protocol by the local authority, the Trust, along with other schools in the area, will consider the child for admission. This process ensures that the most vulnerable children are not left without an education and that all schools share the collective responsibility for supporting them. Admissions made under this protocol will take priority over children on the school's waiting list and can be made even if the school is full.

11. In-year Admissions

You can apply for a place for your child at any time outside the normal admissions round. As is the case in the normal admissions round, all children whose EHC plans name 1 of our schools will be admitted to the school.



Likewise, if there are spaces available at the school in the year group you are applying for, your child will always be offered a place.

If there are no spaces available at the time of your application, your child's name will be added to a waiting list for the relevant year group at the school. When a space becomes available it will be filled by 1 of the pupils on the waiting list in accordance with the oversubscription criteria listed in section 6.3 of this policy. Priority will not be given to children on the basis that they have been on the waiting list the longest.
