Active Uniforms

Children should come to school every day dressed ready to play, run and climb.

- Red T shirt, or polo T shirt
- Red jumper, cardigan or fleece
- Grey or black comfortable trousers or jogging bottoms
- Grey or black pinafore dress, with black or grey leggings underneath.
- Plain black active shoes or trainers, with straps or laces
- Should a Hijab be required, it should be either plain red or white. No loose scarves.
- If children must wear earrings, then only small stud earrings are acceptable but these must be removed during PE sessions.

Reports

Please look after your reports. It is best to keep them in a folder safely for the future. These are an important record of your child's progress and achievement in school.

Please see below for an explanation for what some sections of the report mean.

If you have any questions about your child's report, please do stop to speak to them after school on Monday 13th July.

Attitude	Do they have a good attitude to learning?
Excellent	Challenges self and others. Highly motivated.
Good	Expected behaviour for learning. On task. Able to work independently but seeks support if needed
Requires Improvement	Requires reminders to stay on task. Seeks support when not needed.
Cause for concern	Lack of effort. Disturbs own and others learning.

Is my child reading enough at home?

Excellent	Reads 5+ times per week/ widely/ comments
Good	Expected – reads 4+ times per week
Requires improvement	Reading 2–3 times per week, needs reminders
Cause for concern	Not reading/ rarely reading at home/ lack of diary, book bag in school

Is my child completing enough home learning?

Excellent	Completes most/ all tasks to a high standard/ lots of effort or support from home evident.
Good	Expected – completes most home learning tasks set
Requires improvement	Some tasks completed but needs reminders
Cause for concern	Rarely or not completing tasks at home.

Your child will have met their new class teacher today and will have a letter about this too.
