Thank you to all the parents who attended our meeting on Thursday. If you missed the meeting, this is how we support positive behaviour in school:

Key Information

In school, we have Rights Holders and Duty Bearers Rights holders are children who have rights. Duty bearers are people responsible for respecting, protecting, and fulfilling those rights. In our school, this includes teachers, teaching assistants, lunchtime supervisors, site staff and office

Our curriculum is designed to foster a shared understanding of rights, helping children recognise their own rights and respect the rights of others.



Every Friday, we hold a Celebration Assembly where children have the chance to receive the Ambition, Resilience, or Respect Award. Those who are awarded are then invited to a special tea party with Mrs. Nott to celebrate their achievements.

The School Charter was created collaboratively, with children selecting the rights they felt were most important to them in school.



ClassDojo is used in classrooms to promote positive behaviour and reinforce the key rights of our school and class charters. Children earn points for demonstrating ambition, resilience, and respect, helping them understand their rights in a supportive and engaging environment.

The Three Staged Approach is used in classrooms

Reminder, Caution, Last Chance is a stepped behaviour management strategy that gives children clear, progressive opportunities to correct their actions before a consequence is applied, promoting fairness and self-regulation.

The Reminder

We will help you to make the right choice. "I am reminding you that in this school, we...."

The Caution An adult will ask to speak to you about your behaviour

and will let you know what the consequence will be, if it continues.

"It is your choice. Think carefully about your next step."

The Last Chance

"This is your last chance to make the right choice."
