

## **Attendance**

#### A Fantastic Start to the School Year!

We're delighted to see such a strong start to the academic year, with excellent attendance across the school. Thank you for your continued support in ensuring children arrive on time and ready to learn—long may it continue!





As we settle into the term, it's a good time to remind everyone of the legal responsibilities around school attendance.

Please be aware that we will not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Taking a holiday during term time may result in a fixed penalty notice and legal action being taken.

In Birmingham, you may be fined if your child has 10 or more unauthorised absences (equivalent to 5 school days) within a rolling 10-week period.



- First Offence: £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid between days 22 and 28.
- •Second Offence: A flat rate of £160 within 28 days. The reduced payment option is not available for repeat offenders.
- •Third Offence: The local authority cannot issue further penalty notices. Instead, the case is referred to court for potential prosecution.

Remember! Fines are per parents, per child, so a family with two parents and two children could face four separate fines for one period of unauthorised absence. The money raised from fines does not come into school but goes into the local authority budget.

Let's keep up the great momentum and work together to ensure every child gets the best possible start this year!
