What a busy first half term of the academic year and month of October.

All our children in Fountains and Byland had a wonderful afternoon at Husthwaite Primary School, competing in the Easingwold Cluster Fun Run. There were a number of local schools taking part and it was great to see such perseverance and sportsmanship. We were extremely proud of all the children. Well done everyone!









During October - Black History Month. We have been celebrating the achievements and contributions of Black people, whose history sometimes has been overlooked. Rievaulx have been exploring the powerful themes within the text *The Undefeated* by Kwame Alexander. Through thoughtful discussion and creative activities, pupils have reflected on the resilience, achievements and contributions of Black individuals throughout history. The book has inspired them to celebrate identity, courage and hope, while deepening their understanding of the past and its impact on the present.









Fountains and Byland listened to the story of Floella Benjamin who came to England in 1960 from Trinidad. They talked about how Floella would have felt arriving in London in one room with her family, and initially not being accepted by her peers at school. The children were pleased to hear that Floella eventually settled and made lots of friends. We then talked about how she went on to receive an OBE from the Queen in recognition of her work.





Fountains went on an educational visit to Preston Park Museum earlier this month linked to their History topic. They thoroughly enjoyed playing with all the traditional toys and making their own optical illusion toy in their workshop. They visited the shops in the Victorian Street - toy shop, chemist, print shop and the 'posh' clothes shop, to name

They then had a look round the museum which had lots of interesting artefacts from the past - the children loved seeing the old toys, but were also interested in the old telephones, washing machines, irons, bikes etc. As always Mrs Bennison reported that the children were impeccably well behaved and it was an absolute pleasure taking them out. She received a lovely compliment from a member of the public saying how well-mannered our children were.

Following on from September's NSPCC special assembly, our Year 2, 5 and 6 children have had a special 'Speak Out Stay Safe' workshop and enjoyed some time with Buddy. Everyone was really good at remembering the Childline number and who we could talk to if we didn't feel safe. Rievaulx gained lots of knowledge and confidence in what to do in various challenging situations and they impressed the trainers with their sensible attitudes and fabulous recall of information. Year 2 enjoyed meeting 'Buddy' and talked about the safe adults they would talk to if they felt upset or worried about anything. Throughout school all the children learnt about 'Safe adults' and who they can talk to if they are worried.









The whole school enjoyed celebrating Hello Yellow Mental Health Awareness Day. Byland had a lovely educational visit to Harlow Carr Gardens on this day, a perfect, peaceful way to increase their wellbeing. The children spent a wonderful day out in the fresh air, embracing nature and the joys of the changing seasons.

The children planted seeds into pots, which are now in Byland outdoor area. They went into the woods to find signs of autumn and in the afternoon they made woodland homes for the little bears that had sneaked into Mrs Fielding's rucksack! It was a wonderful day, and Mrs Fielding was so proud of all the children.
