
Spotlight on Learning





This term in Year 6, in History we are learning about World War 2. Our learning last week focused on 'conscription'. We were all given a different character - someone who was alive during the Second World War. Using the information we were given, we had to decide whether our character would have served in the armed forces, become a conscientious objector, stayed at home to join the war effort or stayed in their current job. Ask us about the different ways that people contributed to the war effort!

In Art, our Topic is '**2D Drawing to 3D sculptures**'. Our Unit started off looking at the Artist Lubaina Himid for inspiration. We then used the 'grid technique' to upscale images of animals to A2. After that, we used George Cruikshank's illustrations (Oliver Twist and Great Expectations) to make a collage. Here are some examples of our wonderful work. Well done Year 6!

Did you know...?



Reading with children

Did you know that reading aloud with your child is considered the single most important activity for building the knowledge required for eventual success in reading? Research shows this practice drastically boosts vocabulary and language skills, with children whose parents read just one book a day hearing nearly 300,000 more words by age five. Crucially, this benefit extends to children who have English as an Additional Language (EAL).

For EAL families, reading aloud in the home language is equally valid and powerful. Literacy skills, such as comprehension, critical thinking, and a love of stories, are developed in one language and easily transfer to another. When parents read a book fluently in their strongest language, it strengthens the parent-child bond, supports cognitive development, and validates the child's cultural and linguistic identity, all of which are a powerful foundation for learning English. This shared ritual is vital, whether the book is in English or your family's mother tongue.
