

### Reception

### The best apple crumble

PREP. 15 MINSCOOK: 40 MINS EAST

#### Ingredients

For the filling

575q Bramley apple

(3 medium apples), peeled, cored and sliced to 1 cm thick (see tip)

2 thsp golden caster sugar

For the crumble

- 175g plain flour
- 110g golden caster suga
- 110g cold butter

#### Method

- Preheat the oven to 190C/170 fan/gas 5. Toss the apples with the 2 this sugar and put in a 23cm round baking dish at least 5cm deep, or a 20cm square dish. Flatten down with your hand to prevent too much crumble falling through.
- Put the flour and 110g sugar in a bowl with a good pinch of salt, slice in the butter and rub
  it in with your fingertips until the mixture looks like moist breadcrumbs. Shake the bowl and
  any big bits will come to the surface rub them in. Alternatively, pulse in a processor until
  sandy (don't over-process).
- 3. Pour the crumb mix over the apples to form a pile in the centre, then use a fork to even out. Gently press the surface with the back of the fork so the crumble holds together and goes crisp, then lightly drag the fork over the top for a decorative finish. Sprinkle the oats and demerara over evenly, if you wish.
- 4. Set on a baking tray and put in the preheated oven for 35-40 minutes, until the top is golden and the applies feel very soft when you insert a small, sharp knife. Leave to cool for 10 minutes before serving.



This week, our story of the week was The Very Helpful Hedgehog, where we followed the kind-hearted Isaac the hedgehog as he helped his friend the donkey by delivering his favourite fruit – apples! Inspired by Isaac's generosity, today we made our very own delicious apple crumble. The children loved chopping, mixing, and of course, tasting! We've

added our recipe to our special KVPS cook books, and we've also attached a copy for you to try at home. We're sure the children would be delighted to tell you all about how we made it – happy baking!

# Did you know...?



#### **Retrieval Practice**

Did you know that playing simple memory games can be the best kind of homework? Experts call it retrieval practice, and it's the secret to making learning stick! Instead of just reading a list of spellings or facts over and over, encourage your child to close the book and try to remember as much as they can. You could turn it into a fun game: perhaps they tell you three facts about the Romans they learned today, or you give them a topic and they have to draw a picture that explains it without looking at their notes. This simple act of recalling information, even if it feels tricky at first, is what truly locks learning into their long-term memory. Give it a try tonight!
