Across the school, pupils have the chance to take on a range of meaningful roles, including Arts Leaders, Oracy Leaders, Play Leaders, School Council, Librarians, Sustainability Leaders, Mindmate Leaders, and Young Interpreters.

These positions are not just about a title; they are about giving children a genuine voice in our school community. By taking on these roles, pupils develop crucial skills such as emotional intelligence, resilience, and self-belief. This also helps them understand the value of courage, compassion, and commitment, which are our core values. By empowering children to lead, we foster a culture of active citizenship and shared responsibility, ensuring they are ready to enter high school with confidence and the essential skills they need to thrive.



Great British Roast Menu - Everyone's Welcome!

We're excited to offer a special dinner menu on 2nd October 2025, and everyone is welcome to come along and give it a try!

The cost is £3 for children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 who are not eligible for free school meals. For children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, the meal is free.

Football in school

We have two sessions per day for our older (Y4,5,6) children and one session per day for our younger children to play football in school. These games promote on-pitch leadership from all children and seek to instill in children KVPS values in sport (courage, compassion and commitment) as well as our rules of safe, ready and respectful. Football can be a high octane competitive game and we want all of our children to be able to access the sport in safe and fun way. Attendance

Although early days, attendance this term has been fantastic, and we are so impressed with the effort everyone has made to be in school every day. Being in class is incredibly important as it allows our children to fully engage with our fast-paced curriculum and ensures they don't miss out on any of their learning. We've seen how well-settled the children are in their new classes, and this has created a brilliant atmosphere for learning and growth. We appreciate all the hard work and commitment from our families in getting the children to school on time and ready to learn.

Did you know...?

Sleep



Getting enough sleep is crucial for children, especially for their memory and learning? While they are sleeping, a part of the brain called the hippocampus is very active, which is essential for creating new memories and helping them recall what they've learned the following day.

The amount of sleep a child needs varies by age. Experts recommend that:

- 3 to 5-year-olds should get 10–13 hours of sleep per 24 hours.
- 6 to 12-year-olds should get 9–12 hours of sleep per 24 hours.
- 13 to 18-year-olds should get 8–10 hours of sleep per 24 hours.

Establishing a regular bedtime routine can help ensure children get the rest they need to thrive.
