Year 1 and Year 3

Year 1 have been working immensely hard this term creating spooky tales to form part of a whole class book which will be put on display in the school library. We have thoroughly enjoyed all of the creative ideas the children have come up with including: spooky jungles, dark mazes, abandoned bridges, blackholes and many more. The class have really engaged with this narrative based on the book 'A Dark Dark Tale' by Ruth Brown and it has been brilliant to see the children tackling an extended piece of writing. They have shown fantastic resilience and determination. We have been particularly impressed with the quality of writing the children have produced and it is clear that they are extremely proud of their writing. Well done, Year 1! This term, year three have been digging deep into the fascinating world of rocks, soils, and fossils. More on Growth Mindset

Did you know that the concept of a 'growth mindset', first popularised by Stanford psychologist Carol Dweck, is not just about telling pupils to try harder? Research suggests that to truly foster a growth mindset—the belief that abilities and intelligence can be developed through dedication and hard work—it's crucial to focus on process praise rather than person praise. Saying, "You worked incredibly hard on that tricky part!" (process) is shown to be far more effective than saying, "You are so clever!" (person). The key takeaway for all of us is that praising the effort, strategies, and persistence a learner uses, rather than a fixed trait, is what genuinely builds resilience and a lasting love for challenge
