

SECOND HALF (TERM) THINKING

John Hattie, a New Zealand and world leading educational researcher, asserts that how we (teachers, parents/carers, pupils, governors) think matters most. I believe him, though you may well wonder how the world of rugby union might shape the practices of a primary school. Let me explain. Back in the run up to winning the Rugby World Cup in 2003, Sir Clive Woodward forensically analysed his team's performances in matches to identify how the team could improve. Using video analysis, he noticed how the team started the first half of their matches better than they started the second half.

Woodward felt this could make the difference between winning and losing the World Cup Final, so he asked his coaching staff to develop some routines to ensure the players started the second half just as well as the first. He called this second-half thinking. So, what does this mean for your child(ren)'s education? Well, I am asking Mrs Walker and her staff, you and your child(ren) to adopt what I call a second half-term thinking mindset leading up to and from Monday 23rd February. Second half-term thinking believes that everything we do in the next half term can make a significant difference at the end of the year and to your child(ren)'s future. It includes, though is not limited to:


1. Everyone (pupils, parents, teachers and staff) making sure they are as well prepared as possible when learning starts again on Monday 23rd February so the children get off to the best possible start.

2. Everyone setting off to school with the attitude that every minute counts in every class, so when they're in school they make the most of the time in school that day and thus can be proud of how hard they have tried at the end of the day.

3. Making sure we look after ourselves, for example, getting a good night's sleep, so we can sustain our efforts right the way through to the end of the next half term.

Will this really make a significant difference to your child(ren)'s education? I believe it will, and it's backed up by Carol Dweck's, an American researcher, research on growth mindset, i.e., what we believe matters. You, Mrs. Walker and her staff, and all the governors want that, so let's all give it our best efforts for the benefit of your child(ren) because a good education gives a child a good start in life.
