It really has been a busy time in school with lots happening in our final week of this half term. We started the week with the SCARF bus visiting us again, but this time the children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 participated in workshops focusing on mental well-being. They all particularly enjoyed meeting Harold the Giraffe.



The STAR Council met on Monday to look through all of the entries for their Friendship Bench design competition. They all had four votes each and the four designs with the most votes were chosen and have been handed over to our bench maker!! SCHOOL BOOK SWAP - WATCH THIS SPACE! DONATIONS WELCOME!

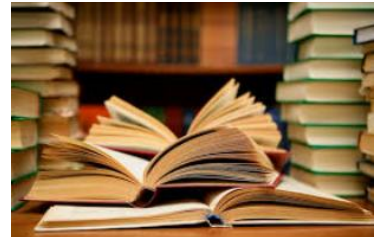
The Star Council met with Mrs Chapman last week to discuss their idea of a school book swap.

Thank you for your support and we can't wait to get this up and running!

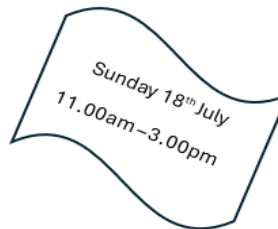

WHAT HAVE WE BEEN UP TO THIS WEEK.....

CYGNUS CLASS

Wow! What an action packed week!

On Monday the children took part in some SCARF workshops that focused on mental health and wellbeing. Wednesday marked National Numeracy Day. We read counting books, talked about where we see numbers around us and played number games. We even started our own smoothie business by 'investing' £10 to buy ingredients to make smoothies to sell! We calculated that if 23 Cygnus children bought a £2 smoothie we would have made £46! It was lovely to welcome parents in for the Number Natter and play some classic number games such as dominoes and Snakes & Ladders.

For Diversity Day on Thursday, the children celebrated what makes them special and drew some fantastic self portraits. We explored similarities and differences between ourselves with the message that 'everyone matters' and 'nobody is a nobody'. We also talked about our families, that every family looks different and that it is love that makes a family! These ideas fed into our banner that we enjoyed parading. We also sang some power songs such as 'This is Me!' and 'Roar!'

In maths we found half and quarters of quantities and finished our 'disgusting' stories from last week in English. In Geography we wrote letters to Miss Seed suggesting ways to develop the grounds. These included 'fun factor' elements such as a helter skelter, hot tub and zip wire as well as more environmental thoughts such as a pond, an allotment and bug houses. We'll keep you posted on any developments!

The children have worked incredibly hard this term and I'm sure are very ready for a well deserve rest! We hope you have a wonderful sunny break!

What a term Ara! I am so proud of how far you have come this term.

To end the term we've had a fantastic week, with Numeracy Day and Diversity Day.

We had the best day during Numeracy Day - we thought about money and how businesses want to make a profit. We looked at a scenario, of a girl making and selling lemonade and exploring how much it cost her and how much profit she made at the end. We were then challenged to think about starting our own smoothie making business! The children explored how much each piece of fruit cost (they were quite expensive!) and then thought about which of the ingredients we would like to use in our own smoothies. We had a budget of £8 to buy ingredients, and then designed and made

our smoothies, which we then sold to each other!



On Thursday we celebrated Diversity Day. We had great fun thinking about how we are all different and we loved playing games with each other. We made a beautiful banner, filled with our hand prints and pictures of our own families. We felt proud, happy, different, engaged and included.

CONSTELLATION ROOM

This week in the Constellation Room we have been very busy with lots of exciting learning and celebrations!

In Maths, we have been exploring grouping in 2s and 5s, as well as beginning to learn about division. The children have enjoyed using practical resources to help them share and group objects equally, building their confidence with early multiplication and division skills.

In English, we have been retelling the story *The Disgusting Sandwich*. The children had lots of fun remembering the events of the story, describing the characters, and using expressive language to bring the story to life.

We also celebrated Diversity Day together. The children created self-portraits and talked about what makes us different and what makes us similar. We had some lovely discussions about kindness, uniqueness, and celebrating each other. To finish our celebrations, we enjoyed a family picnic and took part in a colourful parade with our families and friends.

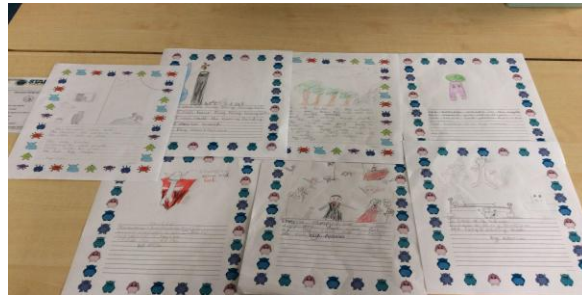

What another busy week for Pegasus! A lot has happened...

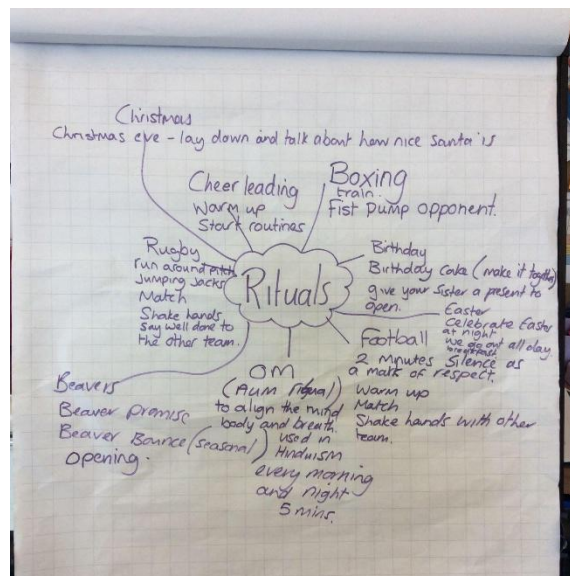
We finally finished and published our monster poems in Writing. The children got to choose between a free verse, repetition, haiku or rhyming poem. They also needed 1 simile and 1 metaphor. I really enjoyed reading all their creative poems and drawings.



The children also finally finished creating their clay monster sculptures in Art last Friday! We then had an art gallery to show off some of their crazy designs. We learnt how to use different techniques to help our monster sculpture come together. Such as, rolling, pinching, attaching and scoring, and creating texture.



In RE, we continued learning about rituals and had a discussion about the different rituals people may do in other religions and events.



Cricket was a lot of fun! We had a whole class cricket game and continued learning about the rules and how to score points.



Wednesday was Numeracy Day! We learnt all about money and how it's relevant in our everyday lives, such as when shopping and spotting good deals, as well as different jobs. We learnt about different charities and created posters on an 'event' to raise awareness/money for that charity. We also got to go around the school and do different tasks to get us talking about numbers. Finally, we played games that had to do with numbers, like Uno and Monopoly.



We ended this half term with DIVERSITY DAY! The children had fun learning about different influential people, about each other and where everyone came from, and drawing self portraits. We also made a banner full of everything we have learnt and paraded around the playground. What a way to end the half term!
