From next Friday, we will be opening the Sarum St Paul's Tuck Shop again!

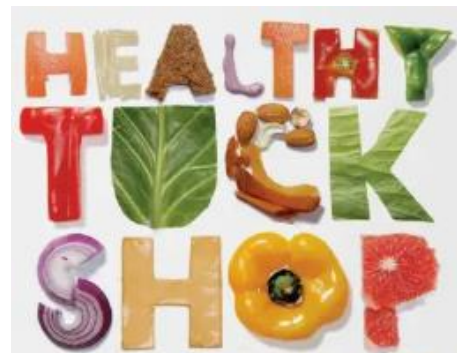
Day: Friday

## Safeguarding – Online Safety

Richard Pomfrett, who came in to school this week to cover learning on online safety has sent lots of information over to us about what you as parents can do to support your children navigate the online world.

During the sessions, many children admitted to being 'friends' with people they didn't know online. There were also many children that spoke of their 'online friends' that they freely speak to but have never met being 'real friends'.

He has put together some action steps for parents to consider:

1. Take time to fully understand what your children are doing online and the functions available on the apps and games they use:
  - Can they chat with others?
  - Can they connect with people they don't know?
  - What kind of content can they be exposed to?
  - What are the age ratings of the games and apps they use?
  - What settings are available to limit risk and encourage a more positive environment?

### **Action Steps for Parents & Children Together:**

1. Sit down with your children and explore privacy settings in the games and apps they use.
2. Ask your child to show you how they BLOCK & REPORT people in the games they play (lots of children can say you should, but not all know how to).
3. If they use social media, determine if their accounts are private or public. Some children spoke about this but were unsure how to make their account private.

By understanding these aspects, you can make informed decisions and provide the necessary support for your children's online activities. Knowledge is the key to fostering meaningful conversations and sharing ideas on how to ensure online safety at home.
