Road Closure

The Electricity Works will be undertaking drilling works under Summerlock Bridge on Ashley Road between **Monday 16**th **October and Friday 10**th **November 2023**. The working hours are between 8am and 6pm. During this time, a temporary signed diversion route will be in place. Local pedestrian access will be maintained.

This is likely to cause huge disruption to our surrounding roads which are already very hectic in peak times. Please drive carefully and be mindful of pedestrians.



Parents in Year 1/2, please allow extra time to get children to the coach pick up point on Tuesday for the trip. We have informed the coach company and they will drive the coach into Waitrose and park on the side road that runs between the river and Smyths toy shop (near the barrier at the rear entrance to Waitrose from Ashley Road).

Affordable Schools Strategy

Wiltshire has recently launched its 'Affordable Schools Strategy' and as a school, we have made a commitment to embracing it at SSP. The strategy is a fully resourced, universal, non-stigmatising and proactive approach which will empower schools to:

- Develop a widely shared understanding of the causes, barriers and challenges faced by pupils and families who are living in poverty
- Make universal, positive changes to policies and practices that will improve the experience of all, especially the most vulnerable.

Becoming an 'Affordable School' requires a shared understanding and acknowledgement of how important 'affordability' is in all parts of school life. We are therefore setting up a working party of key members within our community to work through how we implement this strategy, this includes staff, the church, our PTA and family members. If you would like to be involved with the working party, we are holding our first meeting on **Wednesday 8th November at 2.15pm**. Please let the school office know if you'd like to join. The meeting will be reflecting on local case studies, reviewing how affordable our school is currently and looking at ideas for improvements.

Cyber Security


