### **Safeguarding**

### **E-Scooters and Bikes**

This week we have been sent some information leaflets about e-Scooters and e-Bikes from Wiltshire Police. They are writing to ask for our support in raising awareness among parents, carers, and guardians about the growing concerns around the illegal and unsafe use of e-bikes and e-scooters by children and young people across the county.

Police and partner agencies are seeing a sharp rise in the number of young people using these vehicles – many of which are not legally allowed on public roads, pavements or in parks. There is also increasing concern around safety, with several incidents involving modified or high-powered vehicles capable of reaching significant speeds.

Wiltshire Police will be taking proactive steps this summer to deal with anyone found using e-scooters or e-bikes illegally. They appreciate that some families may be unaware of the legal restrictions around these vehicles. By working together, we can help young people understand the legal and safety risks associated with using these vehicles unlawfully and keep our communities safe.
