Forest Schools

The next Forest School session will take place on **Thursday 15th January with Year 6**.

Times Tables Rock Stars

We are excited to relaunch TT Rockstars across the school and will be running regular inter-house competitions to help motivate the children. TT Rockstars is a fun and engaging way for pupils to practise their times tables, which play a vital role in all areas of maths learning. Just a few minutes of practice each week will help children build speed, confidence, and accuracy, and the competitions will give them an extra boost of motivation. A guide has been sent home explaining how the platform works, it can be accessed on a computer, laptop, tablet or smartphone through the website or free app.. We look forward to seeing everyone get involved and celebrating their hard work!









Time Out for Parents – Support Programmes Run by the Family Hub

There are spaces left on our **TOFP (Time out for Parents) – programmes for January-March 2026**, starting in the next 2-4 weeks. Virtual sessions are delivered by using MS Teams. (Families will be offered support to join if needed). These are relaxed and non-judgmental workshops where we share tools and strategies for family life, and where parents and carers are encouraged to share their experiences and challenges. We also signpost and share information on other services and offer families 1:1 opportunities to discuss further support needs with our facilitators.

- **Early Years Programme** is for Parents/Carers of children aged 0-5 years
- **Primary Years programme** is for Parents/Carers of children aged 5-11 years
- **Dads Programme** is for Parents/Carers of children aged 3-16 years
- **Children with Additional Needs** is for Parents/Carers of children with additional needs aged 3-12 years, a diagnosis is not required
- **Teens** is for Parents/Carers for children and young people aged 12-18
- **Teens with Additional Needs** is for Parents/Carers of children and young people with additional needs aged 12+ years, a diagnosis is not required
