Tuck Shop Reminder

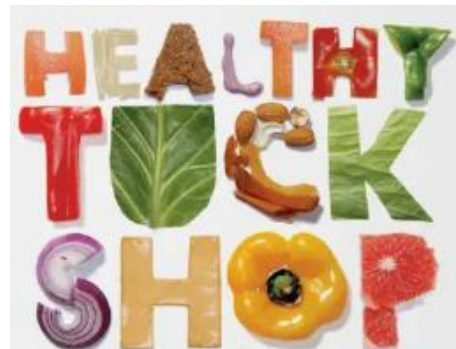
Day: Friday

Theatre Production – Dr Dolittle

On Thursday 6th February, we are delighted to be welcoming a live performance of **Doctor Dolittle** into school as part of the show's national tour.

The visit will follow the usual format of a 30-minute audience rehearsal followed by a brand new one-hour musical production, complete with a beautiful set, a wonderful cast of actors and magical puppetry.

During the rehearsal, the company will teach the whole school five chorus songs with actions, and ten children will also be chosen to wear costume and take on a small acting part in the show. This is then followed by the full production, with our ten children joining the cast and the whole school singing along.

To help cover the cost of bringing the production into school, we are asking for a **voluntary contribution of £2.50**, which will be set up for payment on School Money.



Time to Talk

We are pleased to invite you to join us for our **'Time 2 Talk' morning** in school, taking place on **Thursday 5th February 2026**, as part of **Time to Talk Day**.

Time to Talk Day is the UK's biggest mental health conversation. It is an annual event led by Mind and Rethink Mental Illness, in partnership with Co-op. The day encourages people of all ages to talk, listen, and support one another, helping to reduce stigma and remind us that we all have mental health.

At primary age, this is **not about heavy or worrying discussions**. Instead, we focus on:

- Feeling comfortable talking about emotions
- Knowing it's okay to say how we feel
- Helping children feel listened to, supported, and valued

What will happen during the morning?

Parents and carers are warmly invited into school to spend time with their child and their class in a **relaxed and informal way**. Activities will include:

- Playing simple games
- Reading together
- Chatting and spending time as a family
- Joining in with calm, enjoyable classroom activities

There is **no pressure**, no formal discussions, and no expectation to share anything personal. The aim is simply to enjoy time together, strengthen connections, and model the importance of checking in with one another.

Why this matters:

Many people will experience challenges with their mental health at some point in their lives. By encouraging open, everyday conversations from a young age, we help children learn that:

- They are not alone
- Talking can help
- Asking for support is a positive thing

We hope you can join us for this special morning and help us create a warm, supportive school community where talking and listening are part of everyday life.

If you wish to join us, please arrive at the school office at **9:05 am**. Classrooms will be open for half an hour, and you are very welcome to move between classes if you have siblings.
