Six ways to support your child over the Christmas period

This was sent in a newsletter to school this week and we thought it would be helpful to share.

Christmas can be a busy time for families. We've pulled together some suggestions to help support you over the festive period.

- Keep routines steady where you can, such as eating and sleeping patterns. When it's time for school again use visuals and gentle reminders to ease the return to school.
- Try to limit screen time: set clear time periods and check the NSPCC website for online safety advice.
- Encourage, play and praise: where you can engage in daily open-ended play and focus on praising effort, as well as results.
- Set boundaries: be clear, calm, and consistent.
- Use positive body language: stay present, use a gentle tone, and reassure with soothing words.
- Teach self-kindness: help children practice gentle self-talk when things go wrong.

And overall we hope you have time to have fun with your child over the holidays.
