Online Safety Day – Tuesday 10th February

On Tuesday 10th February, we marked Online Safety Day with a focus on Artificial Intelligence (AI) and what it means for our children growing up in a digital world. Pupils learned what AI is, where they might encounter it, and how to use it safely and responsibly, helping to develop their understanding of good digital citizenship.

As part of the day, pupils took part in an AI design competition led by computing/ PSHE lead Miss Perrey and the Digital Leaders. Key Stage 1 worked collaboratively to design a smart speaker-inspired AI system, while Key Stage 2 took part in an individual challenge, designing their own AI tools with a focus on keeping children safe online. The creativity and thoughtful ideas shared across the school were fantastic.


What does it do?

We are so excited to celebrate World Book Day on Thursday 5th March!


This year, our theme is Reading for Pleasure, and we can't wait to spend the day sharing stories, discovering new books, and celebrating the joy that reading brings.

Our Family Link Worker – Helping You to Help Your Child

There are times when, for any number of reasons, families may experience difficulties and need some support or advice. Our Family Link Worker, Debbie Newman, is here to help as she has many years' experience supporting families with all kinds of questions and problems, big and small.

Debbie can help with:

- Guidance about children's behaviour or additional needs, attendance and punctuality, routines and bedtime. All of which can affect how your child gets on at school.
- Concerns about starting school, transition between year groups or moving to another school.
- Filling in forms such as i.e. Disability Living Allowance (DLA).
- Finding support and information about other difficulties such as money worries, housing, family relationships or health issues.
- Acting as a link between families and school: help you talk to your child's teacher or school and can accompany you to important meetings.
- Information about what's on offer through school and in the wider community; activities and opportunities for children, parents and families; local services and community groups, parenting advice/courses and groups.
- Meet with you in your own home, in school or somewhere else where you feel most comfortable.

"As the saying goes, two heads are better than one. Any problem, large or small, bring it along and between us we will try to find a solution. Be assured that anything you say will be in confidence and with respect."
