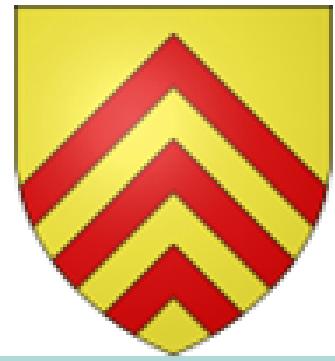

The EYFS team welcomed a consultant, and other EYFS professionals as part of an information and training session and the whole staff attended safeguarding training together.
