After facing hardship as a child, she worked with UNICEF, travelling to difficult places to make a difference. 


Year 3/4 have chosen Steve Irwin as their courageous advocate because of his incredible work in animal conservation. We have chosen to support the World Wildlife Fund (WWF) as our charity. WWF works to protect endangered animals and their habitats, just like Steve Irwin did throughout his life. Supporting WWF helps protect wildlife and their homes all around the world.





Year 4/5 have chosen Malala Yousafzai because she is a great role model who stands up for children, particularly girls in education ensuring everyone gets to go to school. She also shows the importance of having a voice and voicing your beliefs. Our charity is Plan International UK, a global children's charity striving for a fairer world.
