Keeping children safe in school is one of our key priorities. Our Designated Safeguarding Leads are :

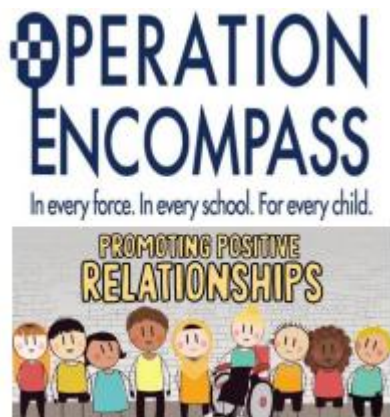
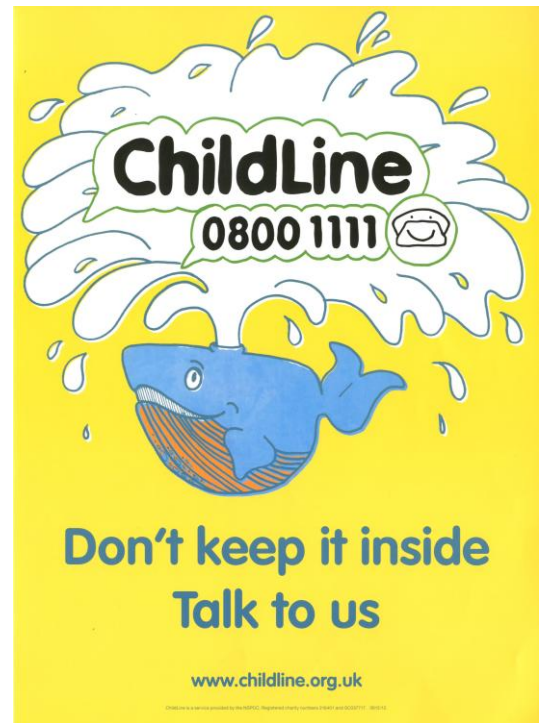
