Dear Parent/Carer,

As you may be aware, your child's school is part of a multi academy trust (MAT) known as the Pennine Alliance Learning Trust (PALT).

A great deal has been achieved since our family of schools started working together. We have a family of Good/Outstanding schools, many with Outstanding features. Collectively we have continued to progress - despite managing issues such as declining birth rates and changes to how schools are funded.

However, the world of education is constantly evolving - and we recognise how important it is that we are always looking at how best we can support our schools to thrive. Having the capacity and resources to continue to drive our success is essential. That is why we have been exploring what a strategic partnership may look like with another local MAT.

As part of this consideration, Trustees have been reviewing a number of local Trusts - and one has started to stand out as being a possible partner. This MAT is Trinity - a family of schools including a sixth form and six secondary and four primary academies.

What really has stood out for us is not only Trinity's commitment and resources to support teaching and learning excellence, but also that each school is recognised as being a unique part of its local community, with its own individuality and character.

This is something that we now want to explore further, which is why we are embarking on what is known as the due diligence process. As part of this, we want to ensure that every member of our immediate and wider community has the opportunity to ask questions and share your views about what this merger may mean for you.
