Year group updates

Kapow! **Foundation Stage** have kicked off their 'Superheroes/People Who Help Us' topic this week. They learnt about real life superheroes in the community who carry out jobs to help society. They have been colouring superheroes and decorating a superhero mask to further develop fine motor skills. In Drawing Club, they have been learning the story *Supertato* and drawing the main character in the story. Just a reminder that children should be coming to school wearing their PE kit every Monday (as that is our PE day) and they do not change during the school day. Thank you. Have a lovely weekend!

Well done **Year 1** for another great week. We had a brilliant time reenacting the Crimean War on Tuesday. There were soldiers and nurses and we saw how Florence Nightingale looked after the people who needed help. In science, we looked at the five senses and talked about how each sense helps us. In Geography, we looked at countries that were important for Florence Nightingale. Our library day is Wednesday each week, please have a look at home for any stray library books as children will be unable to borrow another book if they already have one on loan. Thank you!

We have had a fantastic week of learning in **Year 2** as we have continued to delve into the smoggy smoke that is the Great Fire of London. The children are becoming more confident with telling the time and have made some great progress with this. If you would like to

Please remember that topic homework is to be brought in on the designated date at the bottom of the homework sheet and not before as we have planned time to share this. We hope you have a lovely weekend!

Year 3 were finally able to take their walk around Basingstoke town on Monday. We looked closely at all the landmarks and even found the Blue Coat Boy statue! The facts we have gathered are now going to be written in children's reports about 'Brilliant Basingstoke'. During art this week, we are learning about local artist Sian Storey and we were very excited to find her real art on display in the town. Our next art project will involve junk modelling, so please can pupils start to bring in any clean cardboard boxes, tubes, pots and cylinders to school. Thank you in advance and thank you to those parents who volunteered and walked with us on our trip.

Year 4 have had a great week! The children thoroughly enjoyed making their musical instruments in DT, and they will continue developing these next week. In Geography, they learnt about different types of maps and even created their own Ordnance Survey-style maps. They also had a fantastic time in Music, where they learnt about musical scores. Year 5 have had a busy week as they had a court case to perform on Monday! It was the trial of Lady Evelyn who was suspected of murdering Lord Carnarvon in our imaginary drama. The children are now busy writing witness reports about this event. Also, we have been learning how to handle clay in preparation for making canopic jars next week.

Year 6 have had a fantastic week. The children have been working incredibly hard on their biography writing, and in maths they have made a great start on our new learning around decimals and measures. We are really proud of the focus and effort they have shown. Looking ahead to next week, Bikeability will continue on Monday and Tuesday. Please ensure that all children come to school wearing their PE kits on both days, along with suitable outdoor clothing such as a coat, hat and gloves. If your child is bringing their own bike and helmet, we would like to remind you that these will need to be brought into school each morning on their Bikeability day and taken home again at the end of the day, ready to return the following morning.

Children will not need to wear their PE kits on Wednesday, as the Bikeability sessions will take the place of our usual outdoor PE activity this week.

Medical/dental appointments

Absence Request Form

For any planned time away from school, an Absence Request Form must be completed for the attention of the Headteacher and submitted via the School Office. This form must be completed before any time away is taken.

Illness

When your child is unwell, you must inform us on the first morning of absence by calling the School Office on 01256 473886. For safeguarding reasons, absence should be reported daily and before 9.30am. Please click [here](#) for guidance on whether your child is too ill to come to school.

To discuss planned absences, please speak to our Attendance Officer, Tracey Kinchenton, who will be happy to advise you on the types of absence which may or may not be authorised and give information regarding **penalty notices issued by Hampshire County Council**.
