Christmas Fair feedback

Thank you to everyone who sent us their feedback for the Christmas fair. We are pleased to hear that it was overall a great experience with the new layout and waffle van addition.

We appreciate that this may have been your first online raffle experience and wanted to respond to a few questions we received:

- *Did not receive the confirmation email:* these likely landed in your junk mail. So please put support@peoplesfundraising.com in your safe sender list. See [here](#) more detail on what to do.
- *I'm not sure how the raffle system worked, as a few people were drawn several times and received multiple prizes:* we used the People Fundraising website for this, who uses a built-in, certified random number generator to impartially and securely select the winning ticket numbers from all entries automatically. We understand most people imagine random results will be evenly spread out, but in real randomness, streaks and repeats happen surprisingly often. Just like flipping a coin can give you "heads, heads, heads" in a row, a raffle can select the same person. Looking back at manually drawn paper raffles, we had 7 people win multiple prizes at last summer fair, 3 at the christmas fair and 6 at the 2024 summer fair. It is also worth noting, that the system selects tickets, not people.

Year group updates

Foundation Stage have had a great week finishing their Winter topic. They discussed all of the different signs of Winter that they could remember. In Drawing Club this week, the children learnt the story *The Magic Porridge Pot* and practised writing two-word captions to go with the story. In Maths, we continued working on sharing between equal groups. This week in **Year 1**, we took part in lots of different science activities at QMC. We talked about our senses and used our sense of taste to identify different types of chocolate, looked at x-rays and different bones in our bodies, talked about how germs spread, and measured our heart rates. In maths, we have been reading and showing the time to o'clock and half past. Every Tuesday, we now have indoor PE. Children will need to take shoes and socks/tights off for this. Please could you make sure they are wearing clothes they can take off and put on quickly and easily.

Well done **Year 2** on a brilliant week in school. We have started this term's Design & Technology topic where the children will be making their own bread rolls. As part of this topic, next Friday, the children will have the opportunity to taste a range of bread rolls. 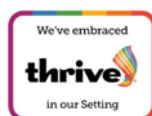
Year 3 pupils have continued to gather interesting facts about Basingstoke and were able to meet The Mayor of Basingstoke and Deane on Tuesday. They heard all about his role and which landmarks they should look carefully at when they visit the town centre. For example, did you know that Fairfields used to be an all-boy's grammar school called Charles Chute School until 1970? All pupils listened really well and we will be using this information in our reports about the town. Unfortunately, due to the weather, we were

not able to go on our local walk, but we will try to go again on Monday morning. Please send pupils to school in their winter coats.

We've had a fantastic week in **Year 4**! The children have enjoyed learning more about Philip Astley and exploring the features of biographies. In Maths, we have started working with fractions, and in Guided Reading, we've thoroughly enjoyed getting to know the main character of our text, *Wild Boy*. Next week, we will be making our own musical instruments in Science. If you have any clean junk modelling materials, please send them in with your child.

In **Year 5** this week our study of Tutankhamun has gone in a strange direction - fantasy! We have asked, 'What if Lord Carnarvon was murdered?' The children are coming up with inventive ideas about the key characters, such as what their motive for murder would be. Next week, we are going to act out a courtroom drama complete with prosecution and defence lawyers!

Year 6 have had another fantastic week! In maths, the children have been working hard to further their understanding of finding percentages of amounts. In English, we have started writing biographies on a famous scientist linked to evolution. They will continue developing these pieces next week. A reminder that our first Bikeability session will take place on **Friday 23rd January**. Please ensure your child comes to school wearing appropriate clothing for

Medical/dental appointments

Illness

Absence Request Form

For any planned time away from school, an Absence Request Form must be completed for the attention of the Headteacher and submitted via the School Office. This form must be completed before any time away is taken.
