Spring term safeguarding focus - Clever Never Goes

CLEVER NEVER GOES is the new, child-friendly lesson that teaches children how to stay safe from abduction when they are outside (e.g. walking to or from school), or online.

Spring term safeguarding focus - Speak out. Stay safe.

This is a program, run by the NSPCC and is a safeguarding initiative for primary school children to learn about abuse and how to get help.

Key aspects of the program:

- **Education about abuse:** The program helps children understand what abuse is, including physical, emotional, and sexual abuse, and that it's never their fault.
- **Safe adults:** Children learn to identify trusted adults they can talk to, both at school and at home, including parents, teachers, and family members.
- **Childline:** The program emphasises Childline as a resource for children to get help and support when they are worried or need to talk about something.
- **Open communication:** Parents are encouraged to have open conversations with their children about safety, using the program's resources and messages as a starting point.
- **Reinforcing key messages:** Parents can reinforce the program's messages by engaging in activities and discussions at home to help children remember the importance of speaking out and staying safe.
