You Said, We Did...

Following our Parent Survey in July 2025, we would like to keep you updated with points raised by parents to support school improvement. Over the autumn term, we will keep you updated on some of the suggestions you raised, and what we are doing about them.

"Can students be given more attention in reading and writing and more time for reading for pleasure?"

We have made one of our school development priorities this year a focus on the combined reading, writing and maths outcomes for pupils. As part of this, we want to review our teaching and interventions for pupils in these subjects and engage with parents more effectively on how they can support at home. We identified that reading for pleasure was a big part of this, and we will be working at putting things in place to promote reading for pleasure too.

"Can it be clear on how funds from the PTA are being spent?"

The PTA would like to work on this and they have been reviewing what they spend money on, so that the impact of their spending can be seen more quickly for our families (sometimes spending is not quick as we are saving money for something large!) The PTA will be sharing this more regularly as a result! Please do follow them on Facebook for more updates, and on the PTA school website page.

"Can there be more parent workshops to help us support children at home?"

We are planning a parent workshop each term this year, focusing on reading, writing and maths. We try not to plan in too many as we understand that taking time off work to attend these can be tricky for some parents, so we try to get a balance. If you would like any specific support with something to help your child at home, please do ask our teachers as we are very happy to meet you and show you any strategies which might help.

"Can there be more emphasis on walking and cycling to school?"

After the success of the Bike Bus last year, which is continuing, we want to build on this and we are working closely with parents and the local authority to support this in the school. We have our 'Walktober' event on currently, and we will be looking at other ways to promote healthy lifestyles where we can too. Please do let us know if you would like to get involved in this!

Thank you again for your feedback, including the many positive comments about the school which we are so grateful to receive. We will update you again on further suggestions which were made in the coming weeks.

PTA feedback survey

Thank you to everyone who took part in the survey. Over the coming weeks we will reply to some of the improvements suggested.

- Prize at stall instead of collecting stamps: We had chosen stamps as it allows the
 children to get a bigger prize at the end. If they only play one or two games they can
 still get a smaller prize.
- Costs/chances of winning: We are conscious that everyone is feeling the pinch right now, so will adjust as much as possible. Even with costs going up we have not changed most of our prizes e.g. we have charged the same for drinks and food over the last 3 years. Year group updates

Foundation Stage have been learning the story of *The Leaf Thief* in Drawing Club this week. They drew the Leaf Thief and drew what they think a real leaf thief would look like. They have begun making leaf crowns at Forest School using the natural autumn leaves that have fallen. In Maths, they have started looking at addition as two parts making a whole amount. Well done, Foundation Stage! Have a lovely weekend!

This week in **Year 1**, we had a brilliant time creating our toy museum on Tuesday—it was wonderful to welcome visitors to see the robots we made in DT, along with our sketching and writing. In maths, we've been learning about 2D and 3D shapes, so why not go on a shape hunt next time you're out and about? After half term, we'll be having a Forest School session on Friday 7th November; children should wear joggers, bring wellies in a separate bag, and come with a coat and water bottle as usual—please note, we'll still go even if it's raining! We've also had several unnamed jumpers and water bottles left in classrooms, so please make sure all items are clearly labelled. Finally, don't forget our topic homework showcase in class on Wednesday 22nd October—please bring any topic homework in on that day.

Once again, it's been another wonderful week in **Year 2**! This week, we have introduced bar models during maths lessons. Bar models help the children to identify what they know and what they need to find out when solving word problems. This week's maths homework consolidates this learning. In writing, we have been very impressed at the children's first attempt at paired writing. The children have worked in pairs or small groups to write factual sentences about penguins. It has been particularly lovely to hear children reminding each other of their punctuation and challenging themselves to include adjectives and conjunctions in their writing. In computing, we discussed e-safety and agreed five key rules for children to follow at home and at school when using IT. Please ask the children about this and encourage them to use the rules to keep themselves safe when online. Key dates for next week:

Monday 20th October: we will be visiting Forest School in the afternoon to consolidate our science learning. Please send children to school with a change of shoes (wellies/walking boots) and a warm, waterproof coat. Tuesday 21st October: As per the email sent, please also remember children need to bring in an item or photo that reminds them of someone/something special. Wednesday 22nd October: topic homework day - please send topic homework in on this day for children to share in the afternoon.

Year 3 pupils have really been enjoying the Stone Age topic and this week sculpted clay to make bowls and they have painted them beautifully. We would love to show all parents our new skills and the work we are proud of next Tuesday at 2:30pm-3pm. Please enter via the school office.

It's been a fantastic week of learning and creativity in **Year 4**! The children have proudly completed their final art pieces, showcasing an impressive blend of watercolour and sketching techniques. In science, we've launched an exciting investigation by placing eggs in various liquids to observe the effects on their shells, cleverly linking this to our study of teeth and enamel. We're also thrilled to announce our newly elected school councillors—congratulations to Scarlett and Aubrey! A huge well done to all the candidates who put themselves forward; your courage and enthusiasm were truly inspiring. This week, **Year 5** have been working hard on our maths by trying to get on the national leaderboard for Mathletics. Both classes have managed to get on the leaderboard in the competition that ends on Sunday evening. The question is how high will they get? We have also completed our letters of persuasion linked with the story Around the World In 80 Days which we have almost finished.

Year 6 have had a fantastic week! We've been incredibly proud of their efforts, particularly in writing. The children have produced some brilliant informal diary entries from the perspective of the main character in our class book - *Holes*. We've also been thoroughly impressed by their focus and determination in maths, especially with long multiplication and long division. It's been great to see their confidence growing in these areas. If your child brings a phone into school, please have another chat with them to ensure they are turning it off before entering through the school gates in the morning. Phones must remain off while waiting in the playground to be collected by the class teacher and can only be turned back on once your child has been dismissed and is leaving school grounds.

Lastly, please return any outstanding reply slips for our upcoming Autumn Walk trip, which will take place on the Tuesday of the first week back after half-term. If you've indicated that you're happy to support on the trip, your child's teacher will be in touch soon with details of where to meet us before we set off.
