This week...

Reception held a Phonics and Early Reading workshop on Thursday morning. Lots of families attended to learn about how we teach the Read, Write Inc program and how to support their child's reading at home. We then joined Classes 2 and 3 to share stories and look at all the things we have been working on together. The children are so proud of their achievements and it was a lovely opportunity for the grownups to see all their hard work. Thank you to all those that managed to attend and we have shared the slides on Google Classroom for you to refer back to, or for those that could not attend.

Assembly

This week we looked at our green Ladygrove Standard once again but from a different perspective. We discussed how important it is for people to feel like they belong. We watched a video about a character who was new to their environment. We saw how the character initially found it hard to join in with others. Everyone seemed to have their own groups and interests to which the character felt alien. Eventually the character realised that he just needed to join in because everyone was, in fact, interested in him. We showed the children how this feeling of belonging is very important and is a fundamental part of Mazlow's Hierarchy of Needs pyramid. The children then discussed what things made them feel like they belonged when they were at home and at school- answers were as insightful as ever: family, pets and memories. I also reminded them that things like house groups and even uniform were ways to help them feel like they belong.



<p>Attendance</p> <p>Please email the school office. <u>Do not email the year group.</u></p>	<p>If your child is not in school, you must notify us by leaving a message on our answer phone or by emailing office.2609@ladygrove-park.oxon.sch.uk before 9am on each day of their absence. <u>Email is preferable as we are finding it increasingly hard to understand due to unclear messages and poor telephone signal.</u></p> <p>Please state clearly and concisely your child's full name, class and their reason for absence - <u>being specific about the illness or medical needs</u>. You must inform the school in advance by email above, if you need to take your child for an educational setting visit, religious observance or similar. These absences will need to be pre agreed by us. No birthdays, cheaper holidays, altered holiday arrangements or similar will be agreed. In line with strict government legislation, they will be recorded as unauthorised on your child's attendance record.</p>
<p>Polite Reminder regarding punctuality</p> 	<p>We have recently noticed an increase in the number of children arriving at school after registration time. Arriving late can be unsettling for children, as lessons have already started, and it can also cause disruption to both the classroom and the school office. Being punctual is an important life skill, and developing good habits early helps children feel settled and ready to learn each day.</p> <p>We would also like to remind families about the importance of prompt collection at the end of the school day. Recently, we have seen more late pick-ups, which can be difficult for children and staff. The school office closes at 3:30pm, and staff have other responsibilities and commitments after this time.</p> <p>We really appreciate your support in helping children arrive on time and be collected promptly. Working together ensures a smooth, positive, and safe school day for everyone. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.</p>
<p>Medicines in school</p> 	<p>We would like to remind families that children should not bring non-prescribed medicines such as cough sweets or herbal remedies. Recently, we have noticed an increase in these items being brought in bags, which can pose a safety risk, including choking or being shared with other children.</p> <p>To help us keep everyone safe and well, we kindly ask for your support in ensuring that these items are kept at home. Thank you for helping us to maintain a safe learning environment for all our pupils.</p>
<p>World Book Day Thursday 5th March</p> 	<p>World Book Day is on Thursday 5th March and we will be celebrating books in all their glory. The children (and staff) are welcome to dress up as an interesting adjective from their favourite book (e.g. sparkly, stripey, graceful, dazzling). We strongly encourage you to use what you already have at home to create these costumes. The children are welcome to bring in their book to share with their class. If they do not wish to dress up they can come in school uniform. Each class will be spending the whole day off timetable, exploring, reading and celebrating books. Teachers will be sharing some of their favourite books with the children and as always, children will be given World Book Day tokens on the day to purchase this year's World Book Day books, or towards another book of their choice at most book shops.</p> <p><u>Sponsored Read</u></p> <p>Alongside all the activities we will be completing in school on World Book Day, we are also encouraging the children to participate in a 'Sponsored Read' in the week running up to it. The children can read or be read to 'anything with words' - for example this could be a recipe book, an instruction manual or magazine/comic! We are asking that all sponsor forms and money (cash only please) are handed in on World Book Day. If your child completes this they will earn 5 Gold Stars! A sponsorship form will be sent home next week, please look out for these in your child's bag. The money we raise from the sponsored read will be used by the school to purchase new reading material for the children. Thank you!</p>


