This week...


In our weekly Year 5 & 6 Crochet Club, the children have been creating projects at various different skill levels, to ensure everyone has the opportunity to create something, whilst being suitably challenged! Assembly

This week we talked briefly about the excitement and the safety needs around Bonfire Night and fireworks. Related to this we went in depth on the topic of Active Listening. We explained that this was a key skill for life (and the Blue Rule at school- Focus). We described the distinction between hearing and listening, making sure that the children could identify that listening involved thinking. We listened until we started to hear background sounds we'd previously not heard. We then went on to discuss how an effective conversation involves listening and responding to another person- ie. Active Listening. We shared that an effective conversation often involves a person talking for only a quarter of the time, while they listen for the other three quarters.

We agreed that listening was vital and to try to limit conversations in which we were only transmitting information (talking about/for ourselves) rather than responding and communicating effectively.

Pupil Responsibility Groups

The previous group of Diversity Ambassadors helped to choose the new group from Year 4 this week. The new Ambassadors will be announced officially next week and given their badges. This is a vital role as the Ambassadors undertake activities such as monitoring equality around the school and carrying out assemblies which present the richness of our demographic in terms of ethnicity, language, religion and culture. They get started next week.

If your child is not in school, you must notify us by leaving a message on our answer phone or by emailing office.2609@ladygrove-park.oxon.sch.uk before 9am on each day of their absence. Please state clearly and concisely your child's full name, class and their reason for absence - being specific about the illness or medical needs. You must inform the school in advance by email above, if you need to take your child for an educational setting visit, religious observance or similar. These absences will need to be pre agreed by us. No birthdays, cheaper holidays, altered holiday arrangements or similar will be agreed. 
