

PE and Sports Funding at Dean Barwick Primary School

Our stated aims to improve sports/PE provision at Dean Barwick Primary are:

- To maintain and increase pupil enjoyment of and participation in sports/PE and adventure activities
- To increase provision for promoting fitness and healthy lifestyles for our pupils, including the recommended daily exercise of 30 minutes.
- To increase opportunities for all of our pupils to participate in shared sports events and competitions with other schools locally
- To broaden the range of sports/PE we offer our pupils – both during school curriculum time and as extra-curricular opportunities available to all
- To improve our assessment of pupil achievement in sports/PE and ensure all pupils make at least expected progress
- To continually improve the quality of our PE teaching, ensuring that all lessons are at least good and increasingly outstanding
- To improve our provision for SEND, disadvantaged pupils in sports/PE
- To provide skilled PE subject leadership across school

Spending Record for SP21 Funding:

- 1. To create a dedicated space to support mental and physical health outdoors which can be used by a range of group sizes and accessed throughout the year.**

Following previous investments we added to this area in 2021-22 by using the space/areas created for yoga/well-being sessions using specialist providers and for outdoor education and learning. This linked to schools focus on mental health and well-being and the School Development Plan Area 3. The activities were chosen to target specific groups of pupils whilst also providing opportunities to all children to engage during the year.

Impact:

This led to 100% engagement across all age-ranges and cohorts during the academic year. Children's confidence in participation in physical activity increased and led on to increased engagement in after-school club activity sessions.

2. To audit and renew existing P.E. equipment ensuring our P.E. offer is well-resourced and all curricular expectations are achieved. Equipment must be safe and fit for purpose.

Audit of P.E. equipment in line with each classes delivery of the P.E. curriculum. Each class to compile a list based on current resources. Shared needs will be identified and where possible equipment can be shared across classes due to no crossover in timetabling. Separate equipment will be needed where age-sizing is a factor, e.g. hockey sticks, tennis rackets.

Cost of renewing/updating existing P.E. resources - £910

Impact:

Investment in our P.E. equipment is balanced between on-going replacement and new additions. This year we invested in archery equipment and this led to an after-school archery club. Broadening the diversity of sports on offer both in and out of school engages with a wider range of children by appealing to a spectrum of interests.

3. To purchase a new sports team kit for sporting fixtures and inter-school competitions.

Renewal of kit to include school logo and matching tops. Poverty -proofing ethos allowing all children to access suitable sports tops £600

Impact:

Children take pride in wearing the school tops and competing against other schools. This not only increases confidence in participation as part of our Dean Barwick team but also encourages children to aim high and do their very best efforts. In the recent cluster commonwealth games we achieved 3rd place in KS2, our best ever result and amazing for a small school.

4. To build on swimming lessons to educate pupils on outdoor water safety.

We used WaterWise as expert providers to work with children in Years 4-6 supporting learning on water safety and safe access. This is something we regard as highly important due to the proximity of numerous bodies of water – lakes, sea, rivers and ghylls.

Impact:

This education is vital in our area, understanding some of the basics and recognising the dangers is a core component of taking part safely in any water activities and we fully support enabling pupils to engage safely with any outdoor activity involving bodies of water.

5. To Develop Staff CPD to provide a greater range of opportunities using in-school expertise.

Continuing professional development opportunities for P.E. are continually sought and the subject leader is responsible for discussing/assessing staff development needs in P.E. This year we have invested in staff spending time observing/working alongside specialist providers to develop their own expertise and knowledge of high-quality P.E. delivery. This is incorporated into specialist sessions using expert tutors.

Cost of training and weekly dance/P.E. session throughout the year – P.E. £1280 Dance £1440

Impact:

Teachers are confident to teach a broad range of sports within the P.E. curriculum. Their knowledge and skills has increased. As a 4 class school every teacher teaches at least 1 hour of P.E. per week (the other hour is delivered via specialist providers. We ensure that teachers are confident with good subject

knowledge. Support is provided for development as needs are identified and the opportunity to work alongside experienced, specialist providers enables us to offer pupils high quality opportunities which are consistently delivered.

6. To develop Early Years Foundation Stage active resourcing.

We have been fortunate in the past to have received donations of old bikes and ride-on equipment that has extended our own resources. It has been necessary to remove much of this from provision due to breakage and health and safety flags. This will include a safety assessment on all equipment still in use and target spending to offer a variety of inclusive physical learning opportunities for all EYFS pupils.

Cost of Equipment renewal - £900

Impact:

Resources used by EYFS pupils are safe, suitable and inspirational, providing exciting opportunities to learn.

7. To provide all pupils with opportunities to engage in a broad and inspiring range of P.E. and Sports opportunities, ensuring that these take place in a range of settings, using the best instructors available.

As a Learning Outside the Classroom hub school we continually seek opportunities for our pupils that are high-quality and engaging. In P.E this means providing pupils with access to opportunities beyond the local area; enabling engagement in local competitions and inter-school sessions such as the Cartmel Peninsula Commonwealth Games; Engaging with providers able to offer outdoor and adventurous education activities requiring specialist qualifications.
