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Ready for Next Academic Year:

Whilst we may be coming to a close for this academic year we are already planning for next academic year. Please be aware of the following:-

- Breakfast and Afterschool Club places have been allocated from September. We are very sorry but our Early Bird Breakfast Club is fully booked up all week, we have no ad hoc spaces available for this. Once again we are not able to provide all the places that are required. It is your responsibility to keep your account in credit or your place will be forfeited and given to someone else.
- Children in Year 3 will no longer receive Universal Free School Meals. The cost of a school meal is £2.90 per day. Please let us know, therefore, if your child will be switching to Packed Lunches.
- Our Year 5 children have all been given a form to complete to apply to be a Prefect. Please ensure these forms are handed in by Friday 5th September.
- Our Baby and Toddler Group starts again at 9.15 on Monday 8th September.
- Choir Club returns on Friday 12th September 2025 at 8am.
- Mrs Duthie will be holding a Reading Workshop aimed at the parents of children in Reception (Nursery parents are also very welcome to come along). This will be on Tuesday 9th September at 5.30pm.
- On Wednesday 17th September we will hold our Welcome Worship at 9.15am in church. Parents of children in Reception and Year 6 are invited to join us as we welcome our new Reception children into the Newburgh Family and pair them with their Year 6 buddies.
- Years 5 and 6 will start swimming lessons again on Thursday 18th September please see our <u>PE page</u> for more information about this.
- Year 5 will participate in Bikeability from 22nd-24th September. Bikeability teaches how to ride bikes safely on the road. Only children able to competently ride a bike will be able to participate in the full programme so please work on bike riding over the summer if your child needs this. If your child does not have a bike please let us know ASAP so we can try to loan a bike (we have to submit our request by 8th September). 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Message for Year 5 Parents:

Dear Parents/Kinship Carers of Current Year 5 pupils

Before the summer holidays begin, we wanted to get in touch with you about next term's prospective secondary school application, and how important it is to consider home to transport prior to making your final decision.

You must consider carefully how your child will get to and from your preferred secondary schools before submitting your application for a school place.

Pupils will only be eligible for free travel if they have an entitlement under the County Council's <u>Home to School Transport Policy</u>. It is important, when selecting your preferences for a school place, that you have read and understood the information available on the <u>website</u> regarding <u>school admissions</u> and <u>travel assistance</u>.

It is essential to remember - for transport purposes - the 'nearest suitable school' is the nearest school to the family home – and - in some cases, the nearest school will be located within another local authority area.

If you choose to send your child to a school that Lancashire County Council does not consider to be the nearest suitable school, there is no duty to provide free transport. You will need to make your own transport arrangements.

Assistance with home to school travel will not be needed for most children as they will attend their local school which will be within a reasonable walking distance when accompanied by a parent/carer as necessary.

However, if transport costs are a concern to you, please contact your Area Education Office before submitting your application:

If your child is not eligible for free travel assistance but you would like your child to travel to school by bus, you may be able to buy a season travel pass from us.

The County Council will not provide extra services for non-statutory pupils and you will need to <u>plan how your child will get to</u> <u>school</u> if space on the bus is not available.

Please call 0300-123-6738 or visit School bus season tickets - Lancashire County Council to make an application.

It is important to plan ahead. Please make sure that appropriate transport is available, should a place be allocated at your preferred school.

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Summer Holiday Water Safety Message from The Lancashire Water Safety Partnership

Following several tragic drowning incidents over the last few years, including this year both in Lancashire itself and involving Lancashire residents in other locations, could the message below the line and attachments (a short 'Float To Live' film link made by the RNLI is also included within the message) please be sent out via your usual communication channels, including traditional (if still possible), e-mail newsletters and social media platforms, to help make your young people and their families aware of the risks of entering open water, particularly where it is not organised and at unauthorised locations which are usually unsupervised.

Drowning Prevention - stay safe near water from The Lancashire Water Safety Partnership

When the warm weather hits, please don't be tempted to cool off by jumping into open water, particularly from

- height -
- The water is colder than it looks, even on a warm evening or sunny day
 - This can lead to cold water shock
 - Currents may be stronger than they look and even hidden
- There are often hidden dangers beneath the surface and water can be polluted

If you see someone in trouble in the water:

- Call 999;
- Tell them not to panic and, if they can't stand, to <u>float on their back</u> in a starfish shape. When

calmer, encourage them towards you.

• Throw them something that floats or a throw/life line
