Here at Stable Lives we want to offer a special opportunity to those who are currently facing difficult circumstances. We're hosting a heartwarming Christmas Nativity Event, specially aimed at families under the following:-

- Disadvantaged on low incomes
- · Impacted by the effects of mental health
- Foster care/ pre or post adoption
- · Bereavement of significance
- Military Blue light services
- Significant health crisis
- Impacted by cancer personally or of a family member
- Impacted by death through Suicide

Our main event will take place on the **21st December.** The first wave will start from **10:30am with the final wave at 3:30pm each wave will take approximately 1 hour.** During the event, children will receive a walk-through interactive tour of our nativity and finish in the elves workshop where they will go on to meet Fr. Christmas in his grotto and receive a bag of gifts that will leave them delighted on Christmas Day - even if it is all they will receive.

This year we want to be as inclusive as we possibly can and so, we are providing a calm and quiet session on **Saturday 20th December** from **1700-1745**. This will be a quiet time within our Christmas craft area. Children will get to meet Father Christmas and join in with some fun activities if they wish to but there will be no active nativity walk. Places for this are very limited, so please just apply for them if a quiet and simplified event is essential.

Applications can be done by families, schools and wider support services including GP's and Social Services. If selected, it is free to families and they will be allocated an hour slot.

We are based in Parbold, Lancashire - close to Junction 27 of the M6 or Parbold Train Station.


