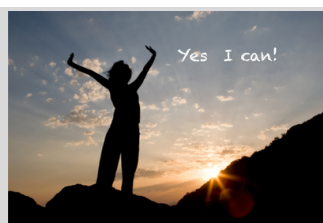
We have completed the review of our Behaviour Policy and discussed this with the children. This will be sent out to parents and be available on the website once this has been ratified by the school governors.

Robins' Learning

The Robins class have had a great start to the term after returning from their Christmas break. We have kick started our topic on 'nursery rhymes and traditional tales' with a fantastic trip to Perlethorpe, whereby we acted out the story of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' and 'The Three Little Pigs' in the woodland. The children were so engaged and could remember the key parts of both stories. We also enjoyed making our own woodland mixtures, engaging in a sensory activity and building dens for the woodland animals. We have also been learning about how to keep safe during our PSHE lessons, and a visit from the fire fighters helped us to learn that we can ring 999 if we ever have an emergency. The children loved stepping up into the big fire engine and having a look at the things inside.



Doves' Learning

This half term the Doves' children are learning all about different habitats. They had a fantastic visit to Perlethorpe where they learnt more about woodland animals.

We have also had a visit from the fire fighters to finish our topic on 'The Great Fire of London'. They taught us how to ring 999 if we have an emergency. The children loved looking at how big the fire engine was and how different it is from the ones back during the time of the great fire!



Kestrels' Learning

This term, the children have had a fantastic time in PE learning about the different shapes and balances. They worked brilliant as part of a team and really showcased their learning in the way they could demonstrate and articulate the shapes that they have made.



Eagles' Learning

For our work on comparing Hinduism, humanism and Christianity, we were able to explore some Hindu artefacts of puppets used to tell significant stories from the Hindu faith. We enhanced our spiritual experiences in RE with fairy lights and sitting together to explore our thoughts and be present in the 'NOW' with God. As part of our D&T, we have been learning to prepare food through chopping, grating and mincing. We are excited to make Spaghetti Bolognese soon!!
